DEMING AND MIMBRES VALLEY

DEMING MAN DEMONSTRATES THAT PEACHES CAN BE MADE SURE AND PAYING CROP IN MIMBRES VALLEY

Deming, N. M., Sept. 12.—A. A. Douglas, who for 20 years has experimented in a small way with growing of various fruits and vegetables in the Mimbres valley, declares that he believes peaches to be as sure and profitable a crop as can be found.

The trees in Mr. Douglas's yard are five years old, and have borne since the second year. The oldest and largest peach tree in the southwest is in the town of Deming in J. B. Hodgdon's yard. This tree is 24 years old, and has known but two failures in the last 21 years.

Mr. Douglas has bought 10 acres of land from the Little Vineyards company, lying east of Deming, and proposes to put six acres in peach trees and can his product each year. He declares the peach tree to be the best drought resisting tree that can be found in this section, having known one tree here to go 15 months without a drop of water except the natural rainfall, which was scant.
