MINING BUSINESS IMPROVES RAPIDLY

Stability of the Mining Industry of Country Is Assured

Chicago, Ill., Oct. 9.—In considering the anything-but-satisfactory condition of American industrial affairs, the returns by 128 American mines and metallurgical works during the first nine months of 1911 in reports made to Mining and Engineering World, would indicate that mining is an industry of great stability.

As compared with the same period of 1910 the returns for the first nine months of the present year show an increase in dividend payments to the extent of approximately \$2,000,000, while the number of companies participating was increased from 124 to 128.

Comparable with the same period in 1910 the copper properties during the present year have shown considerable improvement in point of dividends paid, amounting to \$1,200,000, as compared with \$1,000,000 in the same period of 1910.

Six metallurgical companies also participated in the present year's total of \$2,000,000 to their credit and \$1,171,421.25 since incorporation, a 55 percent return.

A reliable report from Batopilas is to the effect that M. G. Garner, superintendent of the La Gloria mine north of Batopilas, is making good in earnest. The company has been losing money for the past few months.


