FIVE GOVERNORS ARE WELCOMED TO EL PASO; NEW STATES ARE BIDDEN WELCOME INTO UNION OF STATES

(Continued from Page 1.)

glad to welcome him back and hope that he will return again, drink further of the spirit of liberty and free government and give them to the people of his state and I also hope this will be true of other Mexican sovereign states.

Political Funerals of Two. "I am glad the governors of New York and Arizona are here today, for they may not be with us tomorrow (politically speaking); they are here to attend their own funerals.

"On January 1, these will cease to be territories—I believe that is the day set for their admission to the union. The people will choose their own executives and their own legislatures, and I hope they will be represented by some Texas, for they could not do better than to select a good Texan for governor.

"I hope that they, like Texas, will help maintain the strength of the government established by George Washington and not forget that it represents representative government. I hope they will not depart from the document written by such men as George Washington, John Adams and Benjamin Franklin. They could not agree entirely themselves, but they hit upon the strongest document of self government the world has ever known.

Self Government. "I decided that officers should be chosen according to law and that this should not be a government of self will, and it has preserved the rights of minorities under our government. The constitution was not adopted that the majorities might rule to the detriment of the minorities, and you cannot take away from the women and children a

single right the constitution provides for them. "I want to say to the people of Arizona attending the schools in El Paso to take up the history of your country, and to make your teachers explain to you the principles of George Washington's farewell address.

"I am proud of Arizona and New Mexico, especially on account of the fact that they could not have existed had it not been for Texas. "What we want is less politics and more business; less education of prejudice and more of heart, head and hand. I conclude with the hope that El Paso, Arizona and New Mexico will always have the same friendship which existed between them in the past and that it will be mutually helpful to all.

Gov. Sloan's Address. Governor Richard Sloan was then introduced by mayor Kelly and spoke in a clear voice, which carried splendidly.

He said: "If this is a funeral occasion, it is the most joyous I have ever had the pleasure of attending.

"The admission of a new state is important, and it is doubly so when two new states are admitted. "Unless Texas is some time divided into five states, which is not at all likely, or unless Alaska or one of our island territories are admitted, the admission of New Mexico and Arizona closes the roll of states. We have looked so long for statehood and have been disappointed so often, that we can hardly

realize it is at hand, but it is coming, and it cannot come too quick for me.

"Although we may be disposed to experiment somewhat, yet time will convince you that we are prepared for statehood.

New States Friendly. "Some years ago both New Mexico and Arizona were confronted with coming into the union as one state, and although the people elected that this should not be, they may look back to the feeling of friendship which existed then as they may look forward to amity and good fellowship in the future.

Here in the southwest we have the Latin civilization mingling with the Anglo-Saxon, and perhaps, through the mingling of the two and the smoothing of the gruffness of one by the polish of the Latin, we may create a new manhood and a new womanhood in civilization.

Sectionalism founded on politics is a menace, but sectionalism founded on the proper spirit of progress is a benefit. These states of Texas, New Mexico and Arizona—I refer to west Texas—have always been and will always be friendly.

Arizona to Grow Fast. "I want governor Mills to take notice that we are going to grow at a fast rate and I hope that his people will be able to keep up with us.

"It is a pleasure to meet the representatives of Chihuahua and Sonora, and assure them of our continued good feeling. I wish to thank your eloquent governor for his kind welcome, and wish to congratulate the city of El Paso for the thought which gave birth to this happy celebration, and hope

that Arizona will some time be able to extend a welcome in kind. "You have a city here destined to be the greatest city in the southwest, and I wish everybody gathered here today from every city, peace, happiness and contentment."

New Mexico's Response. "I want to say to governor Sloan," governor W. J. Mills said in response to his introduction, "that Arizona is but a child of New Mexico. I will recall that previous to 1848 the whole territory of Arizona was a part of one county of New Mexico. In 1848 congress thought that Arizona was not good enough to be a part of New Mexico and cut it off into a separate territory. (Laughter.) But Arizona, like many willful children, does not show the proper amount of respect to her father and mother. But we pardon her.

"I have the greatest respect for Arizona, but there is one thing and that is that we are going to be the 47th star and Arizona the 48th. (Laughter.) Our election is on the seventh of November and Arizona's on December 12. We are going to be in the union about one month before Arizona. I have lived in New Mexico for about one-fourth of a century and for years, as chief justice, have traveled from one part to another. Since becoming governor I have been over our territory and I am quite sure that no state in the union has greater resources in wealth than the state of New Mexico. Some states may excel in particular resources, but all combined, no state is as productive as New Mexico.

Richness of New Mexico. "I have heard of the marvelous mines of Arizona and they certainly are wonderful. But in your neighboring county of Grant, there is one of the largest copper mines in the world, where a large smelter has just been blown in. We have forests, lumber mills and a school system as good as that of any state. Right here I want to say that the Texas plan of parceling school

lands is being followed out in New Mexico. "I want to express my pleasure at being here today. This city has always appealed to me since I first saw it. It is always a pleasure to come and look upon it for every time I come, there is here something new to see. A few years ago you had two presidents—president Tarr and president Dias here—but you don't get five governors here often and I don't know when they will be here again.

El Paso's Destined Greatness. "El Paso is destined to be one of the great cities of the southwest. The last census, I believe, gave you a population of about 40,000. The next census will give you a population of from 125,000 to 130,000. (Applause.) Located as you are here as the Pass City with railroads running to the east and west, this city is sure to grow. If a place is well located, it does not matter whether it is in a swamp, as Chicago, or in a sand and sage brush country as El Paso, that city is bound to grow. El Paso has the location.

"I want to thank the mayor and the committee on behalf of myself and the people of New Mexico for my cordial reception representing the great State of New Mexico. And I wish you health, happiness, peace and prosperity."

The Two Mexican Governors. Governor Abram Gonzalez and vice governor E. H. Gayou were introduced in turn by mayor Kelly and were cheered repeatedly as they stood in front of the crowd. Bralito Hernandez, secretary of state for Chihuahua, spoke for both the governors and his gratification, delivered eloquently in pure English, was most enthusiastically received.

"Liberty is an eagle," he said, "with white wings like a dove, without claws as the feet of a turkie dove, and its eyes are not aflame with a rapacious look. This eagle does not lay eggs; it lays stars. (Applause.) Your flag shines with new life with its two new stars, New Mexico and Arizona. Let them
