## LAND FOR FORT BLISS EXTENSION

Army Surveyors Mapping Tract of 200,000 Acres Just Over State Line

A survey is being made of 200,000 acres of government land just across the Texas-New Mexico state line. The purpose of the survey is to scrip a sufficient amount of land for the target ranges and maneuver fields for the United States army should the Fort Bliss garrison be enlarged to be a regimental post. The surveyors are soldiers and officers from Fort Bliss and the survey is being made in order to take up the government land for the use of the army. In addition to the enlarged target range which is needed for the enlarged post the additional land on the mesa may be used for a maneuver field for the troops of the southwest should they be brought here for maneuver purposes, as was done at San Antonio.

The land is a part of a large tract of state land in New Mexico. There is but one private tenant on the entire tract. By exchanging other government land for this state tract it is believed that the 200,000 acres now being surveyed can be obtained for the use of the army without difficulty.

The surveying party left Saturday morning with a full equipment of field survey kits and will make a complete survey of the tract before returning to Fort Bliss.
