Hewitt Wishes More Light.

But this was not before alderman Hewitt offered a motion to enhance the already "White Way" effect of El Paso's streets. His proposition to install new electric lights at California and Ochoa, Virginia and Nevada, Ange and River, Newman and Nevada, Summit and Golden Hill, Summit and Orient, Rampart opposite end of Dallas, and Oregon and Wyoming, it is expected will receive ratifying treatment at the hands of his colleagues.

An ordinance establishing grades on Grant and Coles avenues, Poplar, Magnolia, Rosewood, Maple, Birch, Cedar and Piedras, based on the city engineer's statement and investigation, was approved.

Assessments Reduced.

The Lone Star Land company opined that its tax assessment was too high, but alderman McGehee and the council opined conversely. Alderman McGehee, in fact, has been a very busy personage of late in investigating the ubiquitous wall of assessment "too high" and in the most of the cases of the wallers had their claims adjusted by the council. J. L. Kober got a reduction from \$1750 to \$1250 in his assessment. F. H. Binkley saved an even \$100 off his assessment on the recommendation of alderman McGehee. Jos. H. Johnston had \$65 pulled off his assessment, which now reads \$2020. Jake Kauffman was charged with \$17.80 worth of taxes and he wants this adjusted, claiming it is too high. E. F. DuCharme declared that \$1500 was nearer right than \$2500 in the matter of his assessment, and the council viewed his claim through approving spectacles.

Civic League Urges Sanitation.

The Civic league in a petition to the council signed by president Mrs. Burt Crawford and secretary Mrs. John J. O'Shea, urged for more amplified sanitation. While offering no criticism of the present efforts to keep El Paso sanitary, the league advocated that a new office of sanitary inspector to operate under the city physician should be created. The Civic league also urged a strict interpretation of the sanitary laws and punishment of infractions.

W. L. Miller got through his petition to build a poultry commission house on Santa Fe street, between Third and Fourth streets.

The health department offered its weekly report, finding 33 deaths, of which 18 were Mexican, 14 American and one Chinaman. Two cases of meningitis were reported as the cause of death among the Mexicans.

It inspected 231 meat markets, 226 fruit and vegetable stands, five bakeries, 205 fruit and vegetable wagons, 10 laundries, 98 restaurants, 6 rooming houses, 234 premises and 238 cattle.

There was condemned 457 pounds of beef and also one whole hog. There were 82 pounds of fruit and vegetables taboed. Twenty-one nuisances were attended to.

Reports Submitted.

The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$111.86 after assets of \$521.77 and liabilities of \$509.91.

The fire department was twice called out last week, both times to squelch minor blazes.

A voluminous report by the city engineer tended to show that street improvement work is going ahead flatteringly. In the river protection work 2143 feet of levee have been built. Ten permits to open streets have been issued. The monetary condition finds the engineer's office \$134.70 under appropriation.

A. E. Bartlett, building inspector, reported that 64 building permits had been issued with total receipts accruing from the same as \$832.50.

Fred W. Bauer protested on an electric wire pole in the alley west of Octavia street, between San Antonio and Olive streets. The African Methodist church wants an arc light at Fay and Third streets. Both of these matters were referred.

The Fraternal Brotherhood hall must have its roof doctored if it wishes to continue in the good graces of the city administration. The roof trusses have attained the maximum strain. A recommendation that pillars be erected was offered by the building inspector.

Mrs. J. C. Hardwig wants Ohio avenue opened and gave warning that she intends to stop the public traffic across her lots.

SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES

Something of the Men and Their Characteristics; Court Operations.

President Taft, in less than three years, has appointed five new justices of the supreme court of the United States and has transferred an associate justice to the position of chief justice—a record that is equaled only by Washington, Lincoln and Jackson, and excelled only by Washington.

Washington, of course, undertook the primary organization of the court, and that in a day when the federal government was of such little moment that men resigned from the supreme court to go to the legislatures of a state. In his eight years, Washington appointed 12 members of the highest court, including chief justices Jay, Rutledge and Ellsworth. Jackson, in eight years, named five, including chief justice Taney, while Lincoln, in four years named five, including chief justice Waite.

Mr. Taft has promoted chief justice White and has added justices Lurton, Hughes, Van Devanter, Lamar and Pitney to the bench. Oddly enough, the purely human characteristics of this highest court in the world are seldom brought before the people. For this reason the chapter on the supreme court by Frederic J. Haskin, is of especial value. Its accuracy is vouched for by the clerk of the court and its text tells of the justices as human beings—even such human beings as sometimes borrow a chew of tobacco.
