

lower Rio Grande. In connection with
a disturbance central this morning in
Arizona, some precipitation has oc-
curred in southwestern sections. An
extensive high pressure area, central
over Missouri, occupies fully a third
of the country. The line of freezing
temperature passes from the middle

tral Texas, thence to Colorado. The
