Hays, president of the Grand Trunk Pacific railway; W. T. Stead, Benjamin Guggenheim, F. B. Mott, the artist and J. G. Widener, of Philadelphia; Mr. and Mrs. Isador Strauss; J. B. Thayer, vice-president of the Pennsylvania railroad; Henry R. Harris, the theatrical manager, and Col. Washington Roebling, son of the builder of the Brooklyn bridge.
