TWO MEN ARE SHOT AS SPIES IN JUAREZ

Because they were taken for Maderista spies, E. Varela and M. Celazquez, two El Paso Mexicans, were shot down in Juarez early Monday morning and both are now in Providence hospital with bullet wounds.

MRS. OROZCO IS IN LOS ANGELES, CALIF.

REBELS EXECUTE MANY PRISONERS

Americans Said to Have Been Held up and Robbed by the Rebels.

Word was received in El Paso today that at Velardeña, Mex., 49 federal volunteers captured by Gen. Campa, the rebel leader, were executed. Rebel officers divided with each other for the privilege of conducting these executions.

AMERICAN RANCH SEIZED BY REBELS

Property of a California Company Declared Common Property.

Mamulan, Mex., June 18. (By Mail)—Notwithstanding the fact that this state is to a great extent comparatively clear of rebels and bandits, the territory of Tepic outside of the cities of Santiago and Acaponeta, is still being overrun by these bands of looters.

The latest from the Quinicichis ranch, the principal owner of which is ex-senator Thos. R. Bard, of California, is that the rebels Charreros and Jimenes, have not only taken possession of the 95,000 acre ranch with their 200 followers, but these 200 charreros have proclaimed that the ranch and everything on it are "libre," that is, that the property is free to anyone who wants it.

PASSPORTS AT TEN CENTS EACH TO ENTER

Rebels Require All Coming to This Side to Buy Daily Permits.

Passports from Juarez to El Paso are being required by the rebels of Juarez and unless one has a passport with the signature of Col. Pascual Orozco attached, they cannot leave Juarez to enter the United States.

REBELS STRENGTHEN NORTHERN GARRISONS

Troops Sent to Points on Both Railroad Lines Below Juarez.

Troops of rebels are to line both the Mexican Central and the Mexican North Western railroad lines, according to the report received in Juarez. Already the movement of small troops of rebels has begun and 100 men will be sent from Chihuahua to Madera on Monday.

REBEL PRISONER TO HAVE HIS WOUNDS ATTENDED TO OUT OF JAIL

Gonzalo Enrile is now a patient in Hotel Dieu. He was taken from the county jail Sunday afternoon by deputy United States marshal, J. H. Rogers, to the hospital, where he will undergo an operation to drain the stab wounds which he received in Chihuahua.
