NAVY YARD EMPLOYEES ARE TO BE LAID OFF. Washington, D. C., June 25.—Employees of all the United States navy yards in the country to the number of 10,000 will be laid off July 1 unless congress makes provision for payment of their wages. This was the announcement made by acting secretary of the navy Winthrop at the white house today.

SARDINES POISON MESILLA FAMILY. Parents and Three Children Become Violently Ill After Eating. Mesilla, N. M., June 25.—Pitiful poisoning nearly caused the death of the entire family of Jesus Reyes after they had all eaten from a can of sardines. They had eaten the sardines for breakfast at about 8 o'clock and the three children had gone to church, where at about 9 o'clock all were taken with violent pains at about the same time. They were taken home and on arriving there it was found that the father and mother were similarly ill and all five of them were unconscious in a short time. A hurry call was sent for Dr. L. Hines, who arrived and administered antidotes, and up to 6 o'clock in the evening the parents were still unconscious, though the children were recovering. The wife of Anastacio Garcia died on Sunday night. She had been ill for several days. A search warrant was served on Apolonio Estrada and his house was searched for goods alleged to have been stolen from Francisco Barrio on last Thursday. Officers took Estrada to Las Cruces for examination. Robbers broke into the store of Otto Bomback Sunday night and stole several articles of merchandise and some clothing. They entered by breaking the glass in the front door.

TONG WAR DECLARED OVER STOLEN GIRL. San Francisco, Calif., June 25.—War has been declared again in Chinatown, and the police expect shooting will begin at any moment between the men of the Sul Sing and Bing Kong gangs. An effort to settle the old quarrel failed at a meeting of leaders of the two gangs at the Chinese consulate. The Sul Sings made a flat demand for \$15,000 indemnity from the Bing Kongs for a stolen slave girl. This was refused.
