

## COPPER CREEK IS NOW ACTIVE CAMP

Mill Erected and Force of Men Employed; Railroad to Camp Soon.

Hayden, Ariz., July 3.—The Calumet Copper Creek Mining Company, the name of the reorganized Copper Creek Mining company of Mammoth, Arizona, is rapidly leaving the stages of development and exploration work and entering the producing stage. The camp is located about 35 miles from Hayden and is reached by a well graded wagon road, but plans are already under way for a railroad to be built as soon as the necessary funds are available. This road will also reach the Black Warrior and numerous other smaller mines in that vicinity. The elevation of the Copper Creek camp is a little over 5000 feet, the climate being both summer and winter.

The mill, which has just recently been erected, has a capacity of about 150 tons of ore per day of 24 hours, and will be run with this capacity for some time. The mines are located about two and one-half miles from the mill and at present the ore is being transported by means of the large auto trucks of about five tons capacity. The road is laid very securely of a macadamized nature. Grading, however, has been finished for the railroad line to be put in between these two points and 30-foot rail is already on the ground to be used for that purpose. A 30-ton engine has been ordered and will be used on this run. This will eliminate a considerable amount of the present transportation costs, which heretofore have been very high.

About 75 men are employed at the present time, consisting mostly of Mexican and Indian labor, the former being employed in the mill and mine and later on the grading work, etc. It has been necessary to only run the mill one shift until the mine is able to produce more concentrating ore; ore of higher grade is now being conveyed to Winkelman and thence shipped to the El Paso smelter. As soon as the local smelter has installed a blast furnace, the ore will be smelted at this point and a great deal of freight will be the result. Two auto trucks are now in operation conveying the ore and concentrates between the camp and Winkelman. Power for use in both the mine and mill is generated in their own power house located about two and one-half miles from the mill. The water for use in the mill is secured from Copper Creek, a large water reservoir having been constructed where enough water can be stored to keep the mill running for about eight months at the present capacity.

H. Staley, president and manager of the company, has returned from a trip to Europe where he has been to finance the proposition and will remain here for some time. Mr. Gellie is mine superintendent and Charles Johnson is superintendent of the mill, both very experienced men in their lines. A. Avilla, formerly in the employ of the Ray Consolidated Copper company, has charge of the concentrating department in the mill and H. Holden is foreman of the roll floor.

## DOUGLAS WOMAN SELLS THE HUACHUCA MINE TO DENVER MEN FOR \$50,000

Concentrator to be Built and Operations on Extensive Scale Started.

Douglas, Ariz., July 3.—A mining deal involving \$50,000 was closed here when J. J. Brown and F. W. Graham, of Denver, placed \$5,000 in the Bank of Douglas to the credit of Mrs. J. H. Hockley. This is the first payment upon her Huachuca mining property. The remainder of the purchase price is to be paid in two instalments, the first at the end of one and the second at the end of two years.

It is the intention of the purchasers to begin development work upon the properties in the near future. Under the terms of the bond they agree to expend not less than \$20,000 upon the property during the next year. They intend to install a concentrator upon the ground in the near future. The capacity of the plant is not announced. An office will be established in this city, which will be made headquarters for the property.

The ground figuring in the deal is located 16 miles from Hereford. It consists of 160 acres of patented mineral land. Up to the present time about 4000 feet of work has been done upon it in shafts, tunnels and drifts. The property is said to have produced more than \$100,000 in ore since it was first discovered.

**Minneapolis Resumes.** Although few other properties in the immediate vicinity are working at present, the Minneapolis Copper company, which has been closed down for several years, has resumed operations in a small way. There are about 15 men employed on the property at present.

## FINE VEIN OF ORE WORKED AT STEINS

Bonanza Zinc Mines in El Paso County Now Being Operated.

Steins, N. M., July 3.—The National Quartz Mining company has been working a vein of fine ore for the past week. The vein is four feet wide, of fine quality and the values are constantly increasing as work progresses.

This is the third ore body cut in this property within the past 12 months. The company will begin shipping as soon as it has the shaft re- timbered and the compressor installed.

The Mineral Mountain Mining company will begin work on its property in the next 60 days and will continue the tunnel already started until it cuts the copper vein.

Jack (Diamondfield) Davis has quite a few of his men working and they are taking out some of the richest ore ever struck on the El Oro mine since he has opened it up. George Ingham is in charge of the work and intends to let a contract to sink another 100 feet in the shaft.

**Lordsburg Mines.** J. W. Writer, the well known min-

ent. Shipments will be made to the Copper Queen smelter here at the rate of about 50 tons of high grade ore weekly. The mine is located in the Campas district and is owned by Minneapolis, Minn., capitalists. News of the intended shipments, the first of which will reach here in a few days, was brought to Douglas by its manager, W. M. Kemp.

**New Oil Company Formed.** So encouraging has been the recent progress of developments in the Lost Hills Basin oil field that numerous corporations have either been formed or are in course of formation in order to protect and develop their holdings. The latest of these is the National Oil company which is now in course of formation, prior to incorporation. The company is composed of a number of local men. The incorporators are Ben Rice, John Igo and J. G. Krentz. The directorate is composed of John Igo, Ben Rice, H. C. Stillman, W. E. Hoffman, J. G. Krentz, W. T. Owen and J. P. Rose.

The National company will be capitalized at \$500,000, with 100,000 shares of the par value of \$5 each.

The development of the Arizona Oil company's well is showing better indications of oil with each report reaching the officials in this city. The drill is now working in a shale and sand formation. Samples of the formation sent to the north east are of the same oil while the gas flow is said to be much heavier as progress is made. Drilling is now progressing with no delays.

ing engineer who is in El Paso on business from Lordsburg, N. M., reports that that mine camp is continuing very active and that shipments of ore are increasing. The normal output of the mine has been about 300 tons a day. Mr. Writer is operating the Dundee mine under a lease and bond. This property adjoins the Eighty-Five group in the northern part of the same rich vein. The owners are El Paso people and like the former owners of the Superior, are in the center of the rich camp.

**The Bonanza Zinc Mines.** J. F. Johnston, who recently purchased the old Bonanza mine in the Quitman mountains, in El Paso county, about 30 miles east of El Paso, was in the city yesterday purchasing supplies. He has opened up a large body of high grade zinc sulphides, running about 44 percent, and is hauling the ore to Lasca siding, about two miles distant from the mine, preparatory to shipping it to the smelters of Kansas and Oklahoma. It is said that the shipments will start off with about a carload a week, but will be increased to double that amount in the near future.

This property was originally owned and worked by the late Col. Stevenson, father of Dr. Herbert Stevenson, of El Paso. It was closed down when the price of silver declined and has lain idle for several years. Mr. Johnston bought the property from people who live in eastern Texas. The Quitman mountains are remarkably well mineralized, there being silver, gold, zinc and copper. On the opposite side of the mountain from the Bonanza is a rich copper belt, and large outcrops of chalcocite and carbonates are
