

FLOOD DAMAGE TO DAM IS REPAIRED

Las Cruces Citizens Take Steps to Preserve Concrete Structure.

Las Cruces, N. M., Aug. 28.—At a special meeting of the citizens, called by mayor Mitchell, it was decided to repair the dam to the east of town where the arroyos coming from the mesa and the deep canyons of the Organ mountains, endanger the business section of town every time it rains heavily in that section.

Arrangements were made to repair the dam and a force of ten teams and men are engaged filling in behind the dam to prevent the complete destruction of the concrete structure, which forms the base of the dam, with dirt thrown up on the lower side to strengthen it. The repairs will cost several hundred dollars and it is estimated that it will take about a week to complete the work.

Charged With Smuggling Ammunition.

United States marshal C. M. Foraker arrested C. T. Cabney, accused of being engaged in smuggling ammunition into Mexico. The prisoner is in jail to await the action of the grand jury in default of bond aggregating \$3000 which he failed to procure.

Marshal Foraker stated that the soldier over at Columbus had another prisoner on the same charge, and that owing to the lack of an appropriation for the expenses of the office of United States marshal, he was unable to make the trip to Columbus to bring the man here to jail.

District court convened Tuesday as an adjourned session of the April term, which was adjourned on account of the campaign which was on at that time. Judge Medler is presiding and the entire time so far has been taken up in getting the grand jury to work and in settling cases.

To Test Water Supply.

The committee appointed by the Fibah club to investigate the matter of the settlement between the town trustees and the contractors for the sewer and water systems, after a thorough investigation of the various sides of the question, decided to seal up the water system completely, cutting off all consumers for 12 hours and by marking the tank both inside and out to show where the water level was when shut down. It could then be determined as to the alleged shortage or loss of about 40,000 gallons each 24 hours, as reported by the men in charge of the plant.

The investigation of the committee after a thorough test of the plant for 12 hours showed, it is claimed a loss exceeding 19,000 gallons of water in 24 hours, or practically enough water leaking out of the mains to sprinkle

WASHOUTS DELAY SONORA REFUGEES

Douglas, Ariz., Aug. 28.—Serious washouts on the Nazca line Sunday took out a long section of track and three bridges between Nazca and Cos. Sonora. Probably no train will run today. None ran yesterday. People wishing to come to the border are marooned by the washouts.

A special train, run to Agua Prieta from Ysabel yesterday, brought in the family of J. T. Paxton, managing director of the Sonora Land and Timber company, Ltd., an English corporation, with holdings of several hundred thousand acres.

Paxton probably leave his family here. Prior to leaving headquarters at Hacienda Mababi, Paxton sent a large number of thoroughbred horses and cattle to the line to be crossed here under bond until quiet returns in Sonora. An unconfirmed report reached here this morning that rebels are operating in the vicinity of Colonia Morelos.

PANIC OF SERBIANS IS REPORTED IN TURKEY.

Constantinople, Turkey, Aug. 28.—The panic among the Christians in the vicinity of the Montenegrin frontier was today brought officially to the attention of the Ottoman government by the Serbian legation.

A Serbian diplomat informed the Turkish ministers that owing to the possession of arms by the Mohammedan armists many of the Christian population of Sinitza and Dilepoh in the vicinity of Novipaca are seeking refuge in Serbia.

At the same time the Serbian government admitted that it had no confirmation of the reports of massacres. The ports opened with assurances that order would be maintained by Turkey in the district. A denial was given to the reports that arms had been distributed to the Albanian Mohammedans, who it was declared, had pillaged the various depots.

HOLDERS OF LOCK BOXES WILL GET MAIL ON SUNDAY

Washington, D. C., Aug. 28.—Plans have been perfected by postmaster general Hitchcock whereby the administration of the new law prohibiting the delivery of mail on Sundays will have no serious effect upon the handling of important mail matter.

Holders of lock boxes at first and second class postoffices will have access to them as usual, although no mail deliveries will be made by carriers on the street or at postoffice windows. Mail for hotel guests and newspapers will be delivered to them through their lock boxes by the simple arrangement of having that mail sorted on the railway mail cars before it reaches its destination.
