REPARATION CASES INVOLVE \$100,000

Phoenix, Ariz., April 9.—Reparation cases involving more than \$100,000 will be heard in Phoenix April 18, before special examiner Settle, of the interstate commerce commission.

The complainants in these cases are Edward Biele, Louis Meizer, J. W. Dorris, C. D. Dorris, M. J. Pettit and the Pratt-Gilbert company. They demand reparation on shipments for two years back. Their claims are based on the difference between freight rates charged and the rates ordered into effect by the interstate commerce commission after the Maricopa County Commercial club, a local organization of shippers, had won the famous intermountain rate case.

The commission ordered the railroads to put much lower rates into effect. The railroad appealed to the commerce court, which reversed the commission. Thereupon the commission appealed to the supreme court, which is expected to hand down a decision at any time.

Claims for reparation cannot go back more than two years. For this reason the local merchants are not awaiting the supreme court's decision.
