Deming, N. M., April 20.—The Homeplot company has let a contract for grubbing 400 acres from a mile and a half to three miles south of town. The company has received its first car of lumber and a car of cement and plaster. The plan to develop 25 20-acre tracts is already on foot. A four or five-room cottage will be constructed on each tract, each tract will be fenced and equipped with an electric pumping plant, reservoir and elevated tanks for water for domestic use. Weaver & Son, well drillers, start the first well tomorrow, and will continue until all the 25 wells are completed.

O. H. Sellers, of the Ingersoll-Rand company, is in Deming on business. E. A. Mooney, of the New Mexico Implement company, of Deming, N. M., went to El Paso to close up a contract for the installation of an electric plant. Buys Valley Farm.

Elmer Evans, of Abbott, N. M., has bought a farm in the valley. He drove overland, bringing 10 head of horses and a span of mules. His family consists of his wife and three children.

A. J. Burk, expert demonstrator for Fairbanks-Morse company, will be here for a month, demonstrating the 30-60 tractor which has been shipped here. Two more of these tractors are now on the road for Deming.

Dr. R. C. Hoffman has left for Kansas City to attend the meeting of the National Old Trails association at that place. He will go from there to visit his mother in Iowa. He will return here in 10 days.

Glover Chapman, of Silver City, spent a day in Deming on business. Maj. Jas. R. Waddill and A. W. Pollard went to El Paso on business.

F. C. Peterson has received three carloads of farm implements and fencing material in the last two days. Plans are now prepared for the remodeling of the local Harvey house. The fact that the Harvey house in Deming has been turning away trade nearly every day for the last three months for lack of accommodations is responsible for the enlargement of the building. The plans contemplate extending the sleeping rooms over the present waiting rooms and telegraph office, and equipping the same with steam heat.



TEN YEAR SENTENCE IS GIVEN MIAMI MAN

Forty Pupils in Globe School Suspended For "Playing Hokey" to See Athletic Games.

Globe, Ariz., April 30.—Judge McAllister, of Solomonville, today sentenced Plennie Stokes to not less than 10 years in prison. He was charged with the murder of deputy sheriff Billy Woods, of Miami, on the night of January 10, 1911. Sentence is to begin from the date of incarceration, over two years, in accordance with the recommendation of the jury. Attorney Struckmeyer, of Phoenix, gave notice of an appeal.

The case of John Volechik, charged with the murder of a 17 year old girl, was dismissed in the superior court upon the recommendation of the county attorney, who held that there was not sufficient evidence for conviction.
