WATER USERS MAY ERECT BUILDING

Association Makes Its First Appropriation For Advertising Campaign.

Las Cruces, N. M., June 27.—The erection of a building as a home for the Water Users' association of the Mesilla valley is being considered. At the last meeting of the board of directors of the association the president appointed Messrs. Palmer, Quisenberry and Elwood to take up the matter.

The association has made its first appropriation for its advertising campaign. The first fund is \$250, but the total amount to be expended is \$3,000, providing the real estate men of Las Cruces raise an equal amount to advertise the valley and induce immigration.
