MEXICO'S REPLY TO WILSON WILL QUESTION RIGHT OF U. S. TO ASK HUERTA'S REMOVAL

Special Envoy John Lind, Impatient at Delay, Is in Mexico City For Final Negotiations—Women Fail to Escape Recruiting and Are Pressed Into the Mexican Army—Thousands of Men Are Conscripted.

MEXICO CITY, Mex., Nov. 7.—Provisional president Huerta's formal negative reply to the United States' demands, which was discussed in detail at last night's cabinet meeting, will set forth that the United States has no right, legal or otherwise, to demand Gen. Huerta's elimination. This statement was given out today from one of the departments of the Mexican government.
