

NAVAJO INCIDENT IS ABOUT CLOSED

Four of the Renegades Have Surrendered and no Hiding Is Expected From Remainder.

Washington, N. M., Nov. 21.—That order will be restored among the Navajo Indians and the present difficulties adjusted with little, if any, actual resistance, was the opinion expressed by agent Shelton.

No definite information could be had as to the exact number of Indians encamped on Beautiful mountain, estimates of persons returning from that vicinity varying from one to two or three hundred. It was agreed, however, that they were entrenched in an almost inaccessible position, armed with rifles and a considerable supply of ammunition.

Four Indians surrendered. The medicine men, who declare that the schools at the agency destroy their work, continue in their attempt to induce others to join the uprising, it was said, with little, if any success.

Agent Shelton's efforts to induce the leaders to surrender were unsuccessful and the cases were taken to the United States district court. Indictments returned and placed in the hands of United States marshal Hudspeth. Negotiations conducted by marshal Hudspeth and agent Shelton, through mediators, secured a promise that the men would surrender November 22.

Relying on this, marshal Hudspeth returned to Santa Fe, where he received word from agent Paquette of the defiance agency that he had positive information that the Indians were on their way to Shiprock to demand absolute pardon for all the brave, falling, they planned to attack the agency. The chief of the renegades was taken sick and the trip was delayed, giving marshal Hudspeth sufficient time to reach the agency with a force sufficient to resist any attack. The renegades then retired to Beautiful mountain and negotiations were renewed for their surrender.

Three were finally turned over to the authorities, the remainder continuing obstinate until today when a fourth gave himself up at the agency.

The New Social Dances

By Mlle. Anna Pavlova

Preparatory Pose and Proper Position for Starting the Modern Open Waltz.

(This is one of a series of articles especially written for this newspaper by Mlle. Anna Pavlova, the greatest living premiere danseuse, who has posed with her dancing partner, Laurent Novikoff, for each figure. The dances to be explained and illustrated are those now in vogue in society ballrooms.)

THE waltz, as it is danced today, is a very different thing from that which our grandmothers and grandfathers performed. In fact, the waltz our fathers and mothers used was not at all what is in vogue at the moment.

For general purposes we can classify the steps adopted as forming a "Hesitation Waltz"—a dance radically different from the old-time waltz, not only in the pausing indulged in and the deliberate movements utilized, but

because many open positions have been introduced. All this makes of the Hesitation Waltz a semi-fancy ballroom dance, and in the ensuing articles I shall endeavor to explain in writing as well as through the use of liberal photographic illustrations.

At the outset I wish to impress on dancers both professed and inexperienced, that much depends upon the manner in which the waltz is begun. How often do we see even clever dancers begin with uncertain steps until the waltz proper is actually well under way.

There is no need for this dance sparring, because there is a right manner, which is comparatively simple, for the man and the woman to start without fussing for several seconds in the preparation. By glancing at the accompanying photograph (figure A) a clear idea may be had of how to proceed in beginning the waltz.

The man should take his partner's left hand with his right—although this is not imperative but merely a suggestion for the promotion of a graceful and effective beginning—lift

the woman's hand upward and, stepping forward, place his right hand above his partner's waistline. Simultaneously he clasps with the fingers of his left hand the palm of the woman's right, being careful to see that her palm is held downward and that the back of his hand is held outward.

By careful observation of the rule of preparation for the waltz, there need be no hurrying or fumbling on the feet in a sort of panicky fear that until the waltz has commenced uncertainty must exist.

In figure B the photograph shows the correct position to be assumed in starting the waltz. Here, as is evident, the pose is easy and natural, with no bodily constriction of any sort. The man is not holding the woman needlessly close, and his left arm, with his partner's right, is not extended so far out from the bodies as to be an obstacle to other dancers.

Many so-called "splendid" dancers carry their arms beyond the point where grace can be maintained, and most of these individuals show no consideration for dance form by

clutching one another's hands as if they were the last objects they expected to hold on this earth. Not infrequently do we see such persons enfolded in embraces that are tabooed in proper homes and upon proper ballrooms, with the man gripping his partner in a bearlike hug, with his right arm and being weighed down by a feminine clasp upon his right shoulder indulged in by his too enthusiastic companion of the moment.

Don't permit yourselves any such latitude, please, if you would be good dancers. Having got into the first waltz position by easy preparation, and having assumed proper attitudes, it is time to take the first step, and here we follow the regulation old fashioned waltz method.

Starting on the first or strong beat of the music the dancers move, the man stepping backward with his left foot, the lady forward with her right, each swinging around toward the right, the natural direction to be taken. At this juncture there is one of two courses open to the dancers, which I will go into fully in the next article.

SYNDICATE'S PROFITS GO ABOVE \$7,000,000

St. Louis, Mo., Nov. 21.—The taking of testimony in the receivership of the St. Louis & San Francisco railway by the interstate commerce commission closed here by the filing by the St. Louis Trust company of the names of the 59 members of the syndicate that made a profit of \$7,000,000 in the property of the St. Louis, Brownsville & Mexico railroad and its sale to the "Prisco."

By the disclosure of a syndicate profit of \$7,000,000, by the assistance of local officers Robert L. Goodfellow, state game warden, says that the game laws are being put into operation in the western portion of the state. Warden Goodfellow has just returned from Del Rio, in Val Verde county where, with the assistance of sheriff Robinson and county attorney J. Q. Henry, two convictions were obtained for dynamiting the waters of Devil's river. The fine assessed in each case was \$100 and costs.
