ARTESIAN WELLS NOT SUBJECT TO NEW LAW

Austin, Tex., Dec. 30.—Answering an inquiry by the board of water engineers, created under the general irrigation law of the last legislature, the attorney general's department has given an opinion construing that provision of the act which deals with artesian wells. In section 1 of the act the unappropriated waters of the ordinary flow and underflow of every flowing river or natural stream in the state is

declared to be the property of the state and the right to use this water for purposes of irrigation, may be acquired by filing applications for appropriation of the water under sections 12 to 18 of the act.

The question propounded was whether, in view of the use of that word "underflow" in the first section of the act, it was intended by the legislature that the waters of artesian wells come within the terms of the act. The department held that the word "underflow" has a well known and technical meaning and is confined to those un-

derground streams of water which find their way through the land and gravel constituting the beds of surface streams, consequently the waters of an artesian well are not subject to the above provisions of the law.

The End of the Monitor

"Cheese Box on a Raft" That Saved the Union, Sank 51 Years Ago Today.

IT WAS 51 years ago today that Ericsson's famous vessel, the Monitor—his "cheese-box on a raft"—ended her glorious career. On her way to destroy the Merrimac, so far as a great storm while off Cape Hatteras, and with her flags flying went down to rise no more.

The Monitor deserved a better fate, for the record that she made during her brief existence, and the results that accrued from that record, easily make her the most distinguished vessel that ever floated.

Many level headed people, north and south, have expressed the opinion that but for the timely appearance of the Monitor, the Merrimac would have destroyed all the great cities along the Atlantic coast, raised a blockade at Wilmington, made it possible for the confederacy to obtain the material of war, and so disrupt the union.

At any rate, the appearance of the Monitor immediately and completely revolutionized all the navies of the world. The day after the historic fight in the Virginia waters the warships of the nations were not worth a plectyune. Instantly they became junk, and the different governments began building their battleships along other lines and out of other materials.

The Monitor and Merrimac were not the first ironclads, but theirs was the first fight between ironclads and when the results of the fight were seen, the revolution in the construction of warships was inevitable.

THOUSANDS ARE FREEZING AND STARVING IN ALBANIA

Paris, France, Dec. 30.—One hundred thousand persons are homeless in Albania, of whom 30,000 are likely to die of cold and hunger, according to reports from William W. Howard, of New York, who has just finished a 400 mile journey through the remote mountainous districts.

As a result of the Servian occupation, he asserts, 100 villages and towns have been destroyed, 12,000 houses burned, and 4000 men, women and children killed. Many are living in corn stalk shacks built against the ruins of their former homes.

There are 9000 refugees in Tirania and 1000 in Scutari.

A war between Essad Pasha, dictator of central Albania, and Ismail Kemal Bey, head of the provisional autonomous government, is predicted.
