

El Paso Y. M. C. A. Has Active Membership of 932

Among the Members Are 219 United States Soldiers of the Border Patrol; Athletic Work Is a Feature and the Boys Take 5000 Baths a Month; the Dormitories Are Crowded.

THE Y. M. C. A. of El Paso has issued its yearly report of the work and membership for 1932. It represents the work in reaching the young men of the city and affording them a comfortable and well lighted room for their reading or writing or recreation. A good well equipped gymnasium for their physical development, reasonable priced bedrooms and good companionship.

There are 932 members of the Y. M. C. A. in El Paso, and of these 47 are business men, 467 are young men, 62 older boys, 132 younger boys, and 219 soldiers from the border patrol. Of this number 94 men live in the dormitories of the building and these represent all different trades and professions.

Five Thousand Baths a Month.

The boys of school and high school age are among the most enthusiastic of the "Y" members. The quarters belong to about the present figures of 199. In the gymnasium work these boys are divided into four groups, of nine classes. The total enrollment in these classes is 175, with an average attendance of 20 at each class. The gymnasium work always winds up with a swim in the swimming pool and an average of over 5000 baths per month are taken. In this way a large number of boys each year learn to swim.

The gymnasium work reaches a big part of the "Y" members. The classes are strong and growing. The physical department in the best condition it has ever known. There are 325 men who use the gymnasium and these are divided into 13 different groups, of 21 classes, with an average attendance of 20 at each class. The business men's attendance at their classes averages 65 a week.

The attendance at the boxing, wrestling and fencing classes is 17 a week. There are 12 tennis club members, and the association has a double tennis court for its members on the corner of Arizona and Campbell streets. In the leaders' corps are 23 young men who have been selected for this work for proficiency in the work and regularity in attendance.

At the annual circus given as a demonstration of the physical work of the association, over 150 take part. In the grammar school athletic league track meets and basketball games about 304 participate.

Boy Scouts a Prominent Feature.

The Boy Scouts are a prominent feature of the work among the boys of the city; there are four patrols under the direction of the boys' secretary, C. H. Brown, with 72 members in these patrols. During the year the Scouts went on 10 hikes, one of three days, and the others two days and one night, and had four weeks of camping out in the summer "Y" camp in the Sacramento mountains above Mountain Park, N. M. There was a party of 31 boys in the first two weeks of the camp and 20 in the latter two weeks.

The educational work of the association includes a series of sex hygiene talks, and first aid to the injured instruction. There was an attendance of 20 at the former series, and 15 for the first aid talks.

Ten Bible Study Classes.

The religious work is done in 10 bible study classes, under eight teachers, with an enrollment of 101 young men, and six bible classes for the boys with an enrollment of 139. Seventy-two of these enrolled during the past fall. Three bible study dinners were given at the beginning of the fall work for the boys.

During the fall a Sunday music hour was inaugurated for Sunday afternoons, at which music was furnished by members of the various church choirs and musical organizations of the city.

The reading room in the lobby affords a place of social life that attracts a large body of students, clerks, mechanics, salesmen, professional men, soldiers and visitors for their nightly recreation. It is estimated that the daily attendance is 250 with 1200 letters written at the correspondence table during each month. Special meetings for the members are held from time to time, and gymnasium parties, mock trials, bowling parties and the annual New Year's open house and dormitory Christmas tree afford social features for the members.

Meetings at Railroad Shops.

At the E. P. & S. W. shops, meetings have been conducted weekly at noon for the past three years, with discussions on live questions of the day led by prominent business, professional and religious men.

The greatest need of the association is a larger amount of dormitory space, as many applicants have to be turned away for lack of room. There are 58 rooms, and these are occupied by 54 men.
