THE PROBLEM OF CASES WEDNESDAY

Judge W. T. Burns Is Hurrying Civil Cases to Shorten the Term.

Criminal business will be taken up on Wednesday in the United States federal court. Judge W. T. Burns is anxious to finish the April term as soon as possible, and is disposing of the cases rapidly. He is holding court for continuances and postponements every Tuesday morning by Judge Burns, while the grand jury considered the cases presented to it by the district attorney and his assistants.

Gets Minute in Jail. Judge L. C. O'Brien, the district attorney, has arrived from San Antonio and is now in charge of the grand jury, assisted by Robert E. Hall and Charles C. Gresson. A large number of witnesses in the various cases are being examined by the grand jury although none of the more important cases have yet been brought to the attention of that body, it is said.

One minute in jail was the sentence Ed Johnson received in federal court Monday, when he pleaded guilty before Judge Burns on the charge of embezzling ammunition. Johnson had been in jail for five months awaiting trial and when this was explained the federal judge gave him a minute and a half to get out of the jail, and he was sentenced to five months and a minute to begin from the day that he was arrested.

Arthur Walker, the negro who is alleged to have had a part in the shooting of a man at the El Paso Oyster and Chop house, was brought from San Antonio by deputy marshals Fleet White and W. T. Thompson. Walker will be given a hearing here on the charge of bringing an alien woman into the country for immoral purposes.

Exceptions moved by the defendants in the case of T. G. Linger and John Mellon against Judge Booker's ruling on a contract, were sustained by Judge Burns Monday afternoon and a tender of bond and interest from the time the contract was made, was made by the defendants as earnest money.

Grand Jury Unintended. Judge Burns broke one of the rules of the federal grand jury, by ordering the federal grand jury to the jury room without instructions. It is customary to give the grand jury a copy of the instructions in addition to verbal ones, by the presiding judge. Judge Burns is keeping the court records on high speed and is wasting no time with preliminaries. There is now little doubt that the ammunition supplier case will be given a hearing and the grand jury will spend little time in investigating it.

To Investigate Mexican Land Sales. Mexican land sales are under consideration by the grand jury, it is reported. In the federal court room a number of sales in land in Mexico have been made and a number of suits have been filed against the federal officials because of these sales, which the purchasers claim, were not as represented. The grand jury is expected to investigate these sales from distant points to testify before the federal grand jury in these land cases.

The first civil case called after Dan T. White was appointed foreman of the grand jury and the district attorney, will tell Linger vs. Booker, which was carried over from the last term of court. The case involves the federal grand jury's refusal to allow a writ of habeas corpus to carry out the terms of a contract.

W. C. Smith, who was appointed to the federal court as an attorney upon motion of W. H. Burnett, is expected to be heard by the grand jury. He was formerly an attorney of Chicago.

CABRILLAS IS TAKEN BY GENERAL COSS

Cabrillas, a town in the state of Tamaulipas, was captured Tuesday by a rebel force operating under Gen. Coss. The news of the taking of the town was sent to Juarez officials by Gen. Pablo Gonzalez, at Matamoros, by way of Brownsville. The rebels killed numerous federalists in the attack, the message said, and captured 50 prisoners and 60 Mauser rifles. The rebel losses were two killed and six wounded.

MEXICAN NEWSPAPERS CLAIM ADMIRAL DENIES DEFEAT
