Nut Cake

Simply Delicious
By Mrs. Janet McKenzie Hill, Editor of the Boston Cooking School Magazine

In giving this recipe, Mrs. Hill believes it to be one of the best all-around cake recipes it has been her good fortune to make.

One-half cup butter; 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar; 1/4 cup milk; 2 cups flour; 2 level teaspoonsful K. C. Baking Powder; 1 cup of nut meats chopped fine; whites of 4 eggs, beaten dry.

Sift flour and baking powder together, three times. Cream the butter, add the sugar, then alternately, the milk and the flour mixture, lastly the whites of eggs and the nut meats.

Stir the sugar, chocolate and water until the mixture boils; cover and let boil three minutes.

The uncooked frosting given on page forty of the K. C. Cook's Book may be used in place of the chocolate frosting, if desired.
