

SAYS ROTHSCHILDS BOUGHT LAND CHEAP

Los Angeles, Calif., July 24.—Under the name of the Lower California Industrial Development company, the Rothschilds of Paris and London purchased 100,000 acres of land in California from the Huerta government a month ago for a cent an acre, it is charged by Carranza in a message to his agents in the United States. It is claimed that Gen. Huerta received \$500,000 for allowing the sale.

CARRANZA SILENCES AGENTS' TONGUES

His agents were distributing small hand bills among the ranch men and mining men of the district urging them to join Villa, the Americans say.

El Paso, Texas, July 24, 1914. Hon. James M. Goggin, A. P. Coles, Atlas Jones, and Hon. Ballard Coldwell, El Paso, Texas. Gentlemen: We have received and noted your communication of today is just received. We gladly accept your proposition for a joint discussion tonight at Cleveland Square of the issues involved in the gubernatorial campaign, by the Hon. L. A. Dale, as representative of Mr. James E. MESSENGER HURLED FROM MOTORCYCLE

Adolfo Lopez, employed as a messenger by the Golden West Messenger service, was hurled from a motorcycle he was riding on Orphan street here last night after a collision with a street car. The accident was caused by the breaking of the chain of the machine. Lopez was taken to the emergency hospital for treatment, being unconscious. An examination showed he was suffering from bruises about the head and cuts on his face. He was later removed to his home, 212 Hill street, and Friday morning was taken to Providence hospital, it is not believed his injuries will prove fatal.

MEXICANS CHARGED WITH DISTURBING THE PEACE

P. Espinoza and John Doe, said to be Pedro Murta, are charged with disturbing the peace by causing a riot in the county court Thursday. The two defendants were arrested in connection with the disturbance in the smelter precinct Wednesday night. At the time, it is said, that deputy sheriff J. E. Bishop with two soldiers, who had entered "Uncle Joe's" saloon in the smelter precinct, were attacked by Mexicans. The officer was held in the saloon until the Mexicans left the place. Shortly after the Mexicans went out a number of shots were fired at the building. No one was struck by the bullets. A detachment of soldiers stationed in the precinct dispersed the Mexicans.

DEPUTY SHERIFFS ASSIGNED TO THE RURAL PRECINCTS

Officers Instructed to Preserve Order at Primary Election Saturday. Deputy sheriffs have been assigned to the outlining voting precincts by Sheriff Peyton J. Edwards for the purpose of maintaining order at the polls in Saturday's primary election and to see that the election laws are not violated. Sheriff Edwards has instructed his deputies to take no part whatsoever in the primary, nor even engage in a discussion of politics. While the sheriff anticipates no trouble at the polls, the assigning of the deputies was taken as a precautionary measure and follows out a custom observed in former elections.

DEMAND FOR DECLARATION IS OUTCOME OF THE ASSASSINATION OF FERDINAND

Belgrade, Serbia, July 24.—A note peremptory and even threatening in its nature, was delivered Thursday night to the Serbian government by Austria. It bears on the relations between the two countries and deals directly with the assassination of archduke Francis Ferdinand, heir to the Austro-Hungarian throne, at Sarajevo, June 28. Austria complains that although Serbia has promised loyalty to Austria-Hungary, it has failed to suppress subversive incidents and agitators in the news papers; that this tolerance has incited the Serbian people to hatred of the Austro-Hungarian monarchy and contempt for its institutions. This, the note said, constituted in the Sarajevo assassinations, which are proved by depositions and confessions of the perpetrators to have been hatched at Belgrade, the arms and explosives being supplied by connivance of Serbian and Montenegrin reactionaries.

THE AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN GOVERNMENT CONTINUES THE NOTE, "IS UNABLE LONGER TO PURSUE AN ATTITUDE OF FORBEARANCE"

The note, which is a continuation of the one delivered to the Serbian government on June 28, says that the Austro-Hungarian government is unable longer to pursue an attitude of forbearance toward the Serbian government. It demands that the Serbian government should make assurance that it condemns the dangerous propaganda whose aim is to detach from the Austro-Hungarian empire its territory and also that the Serbian government shall no longer permit the maintenance and this criminal propaganda.

Chicago, Ill., July 24.—Moderate temperature, which succeeded Thursday's torrid wave throughout the central west, continued today and was further freshened by showers. In this city the mercury stood at 75 degrees at noon, 23 degrees lower than the high mark Thursday.
