13,000,000 PESOS FIAT CURRENCY

Plans to Break Agreement Said to Have Been Made With Carranza.

Villa is preparing to issue \$13,000,000 worth of fiat money at Chihuahua. The issue is expected to be put into circulation at once and a part of it is expected to be used to purchase ammunition, rifles and artillery equipment for Villa's army.

This adds another significant detail to the evidence that Villa is preparing to openly defy Carranza. When the breach between Carranza and Villa was finally patched up last outward appearance, one of the agreements was that Carranza was to handle all financial matters on its bill.

Leader of Northern Mexico Is Said to Be Openly Opposing Carranza.

While the "Constitutionalist" troops loyal to Carranza are moving south towards Mexico City, presumably for its occupation, the army of Gen. Pancho Villa continues to remain in the north.

Emilio Madero, brother of the late president of Mexico, is said to be Villa's latest choice for the provisional presidency. Villa is said to have been so far in his conduct as to ask Mr. Carranza to resign.

Washington for Villa. The United States is believed to be favorably disposed towards Carranza.

Indications of War. Everything on the border indicates that Villa is preparing to attack Carranza.
