

FOREIGNERS ARE GOING HOME TO ENGAGE IN WAR

Several Thousand Reservists in Southwestern Mining Camps Already on Way.

Since Austria-Hungary declared war against Serbia, involving all Europe in conflict, more than 5000 foreigners have left the southwest for their native homes to take up arms against the common enemy.

Nearly each train going east through this city carries a number of foreigners who are going to Europe to enlist. Many of them are reservists who have been called to the colors during the past few days.

Germany wants no more reservists at present according to a message that was received by German Consul Max Weber, of Juarez, Friday.

According to advices received by the consulate in this city 250 Servians, Austrians and Poles have departed from the Dawson, N. M., coal fields during the past week.

Foreign Exodus Continues. Many foreigners are leaving Silver City and Santa Rita, N. M., en route between here and San Antonio.

H. C. Nyles, vice consul of the British government at El Paso, is returning here from New York City.

Austria will pay the fare of all its subjects who will return home to fight, while Germans are expected to return as a matter of patriotic duty and to pay their own passage if they are able.

A large number of the reservists are married and many of them have little business enterprises of their own in this city and in the New Mexico and Arizona mining camps.

HALF A MILLION FOR SOLDIERS AND FT. CONTRACTORS

El Paso Prosperity Is Increased \$500,000 For One Month's Expenditures.

Prosperity—\$500,000 worth of it—arrived in El Paso this week in the form of the government money to pay the border brigade, to buy supplies for the soldiers and to pay for construction work on bigger Fort Bliss.

Capt. William E. Hunt, district pay and quartermaster, estimates the total expenditure to be \$500,000 for the month of July, and the money is now being paid to the patrol troops and government contractors.

The total payroll account will amount to \$200,000. The \$50,000 for the troops at Fort Bliss is not included in this sum.

All in Spent Here. Practically all of the money is spent in El Paso. The soldiers send very little of their pay away from the city.
