LANE FIGHTS FOR DOMINATION OVER McLEMORE

Asserts that Missing Returns From Five Counties Will Put Him In.

What promises to be one of the liveliest fights of the Democratic state convention, opening tomorrow, is the contest which W. P. Lane is expected to fight against Jeff McLemore as the candidate for congressmen at large.

Lane claims that five counties have not yet reported their returns, and these counties, according to the Dallas News, will give Lane a vote of 268, which would wipe out the apparent majority of 123 in favor of McLemore on the face of the returns now in, and actually give Lane 66 majority.

State senator T. McGreggor, of Austin, is reported to be preparing a plank for the Democratic platform which he will introduce before the convention when it meets Tuesday.

Everything is in readiness at the big canvas pavilion for the opening of the Democratic state convention, which will convene Tuesday morning.
