SONORA PEACE MEETING STARTS

Villa and Carranza Arrive in Border Sonora Point a Little After Midnight.

NOGALLES, Sonora, Mex., Aug. 28.—To arrange peace in the state of Sonora, Francisco Villa and Alvaro Obregon today began negotiations looking to the ending of hostilities between the factions of Gov. J. M. Maytorena and Col. Elias Calles.

The Sonora peace conference, which may result in changing the entire military and civil government of that state, began its sessions Friday morning.

The last reports of the movements of the military forces of the state that he had dispatched two train loads of men against Cananea, which is held by Col. Elias Calles, head of the military faction.
