

GET BIG NUGGET RICH IN SILVER

Taken From the Silver Cell Mine at Pinos Altos, and Weighs 34 Pounds.

Silver City, N. M., Sept. 28.—A nugget said to be of almost pure silver, weighing 34 pounds, is on display here, having been taken from the Silver Cell mine at Pinos Altos, by the Messrs. C. W. McHenry and Dr. E. H. Guder.

Silver Hill to Be Developed. The Silver Hill mine at Pinos Altos, which adjoins the Langston mine, the scene of recent fabulous gold strikes, is to be developed by J. W. Bettes and T. R. Fisher, lessees.

The lessees will incorporate a company and install \$50,000 to carry on the work of operating the mine. Since January, last, 1500 feet of tunnel work has been done and indications are for the finding of ore running high in gold values.

Recently Maj. St. Clair Douglas, a mining man, formerly of Guadalupe, Mex., negotiated for the purchase of the Silver Hill property, but the deal did not go through.

GOLD AND SILVER FOUND IN ORGAN MOUNTAIN MINE

Las Cruces, N. M., Sept. 28.—Gold and silver have been found by Alfred Poo at the Memphis mine, in the Organ mountains. Poo leased the north end of the Memphis mine and has been working on it for several weeks.

He sank a new shaft and struck a large ore body which ran 14.5 percent copper, 8 ounces of silver and 12 percent in gold when it was shipped to the El Paso smelter. The stone shows ore of similar grade throughout and Poo is preparing to develop the property.

John Bonny has also made a rich strike in the White Signal group, taking out gold which ran 1190 to the ton.

CLEVELAND MINE MAY HAVE SULPHIDE TREATING PLANT. Silver City, N. M., Sept. 29.—A mill for the treatment of sulphides may be erected on the Cleveland property near here.

ARIZONA MINES YIELD MORE ORE

Smelters Gradually Increase Output, and Bisbee and Douglas Prosper.

Douglas, Ariz., Sept. 28.—With the mines at Bisbee taking on more men steadily, though only a few at a time, and the smelters here handling more ore, both Douglas and Bisbee have recovered confidence fully and both towns are doing nicely as much business as ever.

Stanley Harris, who has been prospecting in the Santa Rita mountains of Pima county, has returned here. He has acquired near Greenerville a property in which he has much faith, and is preparing to begin development work.

BURRO TRAINS ARE USED IN NEW MEXICO

Santa Fe, N. M., Sept. 28.—The burro train for carrying ore has not yet entirely disappeared from New Mexico, as a report from Kingston, Sierra county, indicates, for Col. Finch and associates are packing their ore from the Overlook silver mine, a distance of 15 miles, on the backs of 25 burros.

This is necessitated because of the bad condition of the wagon road between Kingston and Lake Valley. A system of leaching the ore in the Franklin Hill camp at Kingston is planned so as to save the values on the various dumps of low grade ore.

DERRICKS STOP IN CARLSBAD WELL

The Standard Oil Company Moves Casing and Machinery to Oklahoma.

Carlsbad, N. M., Sept. 28.—Drilling has been suspended in the oil well six miles east of Carlsbad and the casing and machinery which had been bought at great expense, was ordered to be shipped to Oklahoma, where the Standard Oil company is making test wells similar to the one here.

The cost of the well here to date is about \$15,000. Those in charge of the well say that at 2100 feet a strata of oil sand was encountered which gave evidences of a very fine quality of petroleum.

COPPER INTERESTS PROTEST AGAINST STOPPING SHIPMENTS

Washington, D. C., Sept. 28.—Interference by the British government with American copper shipments to Rotterdam, Holland, is protested against by the copper industry.

The telegram said the action of the British government seriously endangered the copper industry and was unreasonable.

35000 TROOPS TO BE HELD AT FORT BLISS

Annual Maneuvers in October May Include Entire Southern Department.

Announcement has been made that maneuvers are to be held at the middle of the month and it is reported that these are to be enlarged into general tactical maneuvers for the whole department.


