

## NINE TEAMS IN COLLEGE LEAGUE

Basketball Enthusiasm Gets Hold of Students; Tennis Club Is Formed.

Medilla, Park, Oct. 15.—Coach Russell is infusing enthusiasm into the college students on the subject of basketball. A basketball league of seven teams has been organized. 28 men belonging to such teams from which 24 men will be selected. This makes about 146 men who are participating in the daily practice of basketball and all trying to make their respective teams as good as they can be in the tournament and help win the series of games to be played. The following men are managers of the seven groups: Fred Humble, Chester, Garrett, Edward Wharton, Harvey Cox, Karl Hillman, Milton Blackwell and William Bauman. The tournament, or series of games, will run about 14 weeks, and following the last game a banquet will be given the winning team by the members of the other teams.

On Saturday the first football team goes to El Paso to play a select team of Y. M. C. A. men. The college men are expecting the hardest battle they have fought thus far this season, and are preparing to meet. Russell put the men through stiff practice every day this week.

The college students have organized a tennis club, with Jackson Maxwell as president, Lowell Locke, vice president, and Maurice Mitchell, secretary-treasurer. Frank Shekton and Robert Latta represent the faculty, and with the president of the association will constitute an advisory board. The girls of the college have also formed an association, with Miss Hager as president and Miss Julia Remblin, secretary-treasurer.

## FILIBUSTERS AT CASAS GRANDES

Band Attacks the Villa Garrison There; Reported to Be Quite Large.

Casas Grandes was attacked Thursday evening, according to reports received both in Juarez and by Constitutionalists on this side. The advisers are meager but indicate that the attacking force was a collection of filibuster bands that have been operating in northwestern Chihuahua.

Since the capture of Rodrigo Quevedo there has been little activity shown by the "colorados" until about a week ago, when the headquarters of the Palomas Land & Cattle company was attacked. Reports have been received here recently that the scattered bands have been concentrating around Lake Guzman. The attack on Casas Grandes would indicate that the filibuster bands now have a large force, as it is known that the Villista garrison at Casas Grandes numbers about 300 men, supported with one machine gun. According to one report, an officer who deserted with Maclovio Herrera is at the head of the filibusters.

**RANDALL IN THE CITY ON HIS WAY TO MEXICO CITY.**

## CARRANZA HAS NOT RESIGNED

Thinks Action of Mexico City Convention Sufficient for the Time Being.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 15.—Gen. Carranza's resignation has not been presented to the Mexican convention at Aguascalientes. Today's reports to the state department reiterated that the question of his resignation would not be taken up until additional delegates from Zapata had arrived. Official dispatches today said the temporary organization of the convention had been made permanent and the delegates whose credentials had been approved numbered 100. All took the oath of swearing to abide by the decision of the convention, which was proclaimed the sovereign power in Mexico.

Although it is supreme in authority, it is not believed the convention will attempt to exercise legislative or executive functions beyond designating the individual or individuals who shall discharge the executive power in succession to Carranza.

**Carranza to Be Candidate.**  
His retirement as "first chief in charge of the executive power" is expected on all sides, as a matter of course, because he is desirous of being a candidate in the presidential election and the Mexican constitution prohibits the executive who conducts the election from being a candidate therein.

**Presidential Succession Settled.**  
Foreign minister Fabela, in a statement from Mexico City, said that Carranza considered that the action of the Mexican convention in resigning his resignation settled the question, but if the convention at Aguascalientes voted to reconsider the matter, Carranza would bow to the will of the majority.

Reports from Aguascalientes are that the question of the presidential succession was settled at a secret session Thursday.

**Fear Trouble With U. S.**  
Charges that Maytorena's men have repeatedly crossed and recrossed the border in the vicinity of Naco and Agua Prieta, threatening serious complications with the United States, have been reported to the Aguascalientes convention. Carranza is asked to reconsider the matter to the extent that he might take steps to prevent complications with the United States.

**Thinks ex-Federal Dangerous.**  
Roberto Pasquera declared it dangerous to permit ex-Huerta officers to join the Constitutionalists. He urged that the convention adopt a resolution prohibiting such enlistments. He said 48 federal officers had been accepted with Villa and that others were negotiating with the purpose of enlisting.

**Deer Damage Confession.**  
The Villa headquarters here denounced as untrue reports that Villa had confiscated properties worth \$1,000,000 in the state of Durango. A dispatch from Villa sources at El Paso to this effect was made public.

**NATIONAL RAILWAYS BOARD MEETS, ELECTS OFFICERS.**  
Mexico City, Mex., Oct. 14.—A meeting of the new board of directors of the National Railways of Mexico was held Thursday night and the following officers elected: Chairman, Carlos de la Torre; vice chairman, E. A. De Lima; secretary, Juan Taunay; executive president, Luis Calavera; first vice president, Alberto Pani; second vice president, Charles Hudson.

**OPENING OF NEW BANK IN JUAREZ IS DELAYED.**


