Mother of 25 Children Dies at Age of 107 and Was Married 94 Years

Los Angeles, Cal., Oct. 28.—A resident of Los Angeles since her marriage 94 years ago, and the mother of 25 children, Mrs. Juana de Rubio, aged 107, died last night at the home of one of her daughters, Mrs. Lucy Forbes, 459 West 53th place. The aged woman retained her faculties unimpaired until a few days preceding her death. Mrs. De Rubio was born in San Diego and at the age of 15 years married Jose de Rubio and moved with him to Los Angeles to live. Her husband passed away about 2 years ago. Mrs. De Rubio has 25 children, 10 of whom are still living. Her surviving children included three sets of twins, only five survive her, four married daughters and a son. Besides Mrs. Forbes, the living daughters are Mrs. S. Butler, of El Monte; Mrs. Francis Barry, of Los Angeles and Mrs. E. M. Staples, of this city. The surviving son is David de Rubio, of this city.
