

AIRSHIPS ALTER THE WAR GAME

Chief of Signal Corps Points Out Changes Shown in the European War.

Washington, D. C., Nov. 6.—The aeroplane has wrought tremendous changes in the game of war, according to the annual report of Brig. Gen. Scriven, chief of the army signal corps...

It is probable that the aeroplane and to some smaller degree, all air craft, have altered, not the principles of strategy which are immutable but the theory and application of grand tactics.

Although it concedes the value of the air craft in reconnaissance and the collection and transmission of information, Gen. Scriven thinks that as instruments of offense they are still in the experimental stage.

U. S. MARINES LAND AT BELFOUT, REPLY ASSERTS

Washington, D. C., Nov. 6.—Neither the navy nor the state department Thursday night had received any word of the reported landing of American marines at Belfout. Officials were inclined to be slow in crediting the report, though they admitted that it was possible that the armored cruiser North Carolina had sent a detachment of marines ashore at the request of the American consul there.

GERMAN WITH PLANS FOR DYNAMITING CANAL JAHED

London, Eng., Nov. 6.—The Alexandria, Egypt, correspondent of the Exchange Telegraph sends the following dispatch: "A German officer named Mors was arrested by the Egyptian police on his return from Turkey with plans for dynamiting the Suez canal. He was sentenced by court martial to imprisonment for life."

ASSERTS GERMAN RIGHT SMASHED

Correspondent Declares that Guns, Stores and Wounded Are Abandoned in Rout.

London, Eng., Nov. 6.—The German retreat from northern Belgium has been nothing less than a rout, according to the correspondent of the Daily Mail under date of November 5. Dun Kirk, Calais and the neighboring towns are expecting great relief.

The German right is smashed like a fallen wine glass. Guns, stores, rifles and even the wounded were abandoned in the rout from this fatal battlefield. The chance of the Germans was well on the wane when the flooding of their positions came as a climax of the disaster.

There is a now left no more than a remnant of the German force which met its fate at the Yser. Thirty thousand Germans, say the Belgians, have been put out of the fight on this line. Not a single gun remains on this side of the river and the unburied dead, the drowned and wounded, with the memory of all the trains of wounded that left the firing line in recent days, lead one to think that there is no overrating of the enemy's loss.

PRINCE JOACHIM WOUNDED. Amsterdam, Holland, Nov. 6.—Prince Joachim Albrecht of Prussia, son of the late regent of Brunswick, has been wounded while fighting in France, according to the Telegram.
