BEALL SCHOOL MAKES ATTENDANCE RECORD


Because it attained the record of having 99 percent in attendance during the month of October and so tardies, the seventh grade of the Beall school will have a half day holiday some day this week.

MAN ARRESTED IN LONDON AS A SPY WELL KNOWN HERE

Horst Von der Goltz, who, according to advices from London has been arrested in that city charged with being a German spy, is well known here as Gen. Salvador Mercado at Chihuahua, charged with being a spy, and was only released on strong representations from the German consul, and upon promise never to return to Mexico. Later he joined Villa, being appointed a lieutenant on his staff. While in El Paso it is claimed he represented himself as a relative of Gen. Von der Goltz. According to German consular representatives, he is in no way related to the German fighter.

THE GERMAN CRUISER SCHARNHORST

The Scharnhorst is one of the German cruisers which sank the British flag-ship Good Hope and disabled two other ships off the coast of Chile. The engagement was one-sided. Five new German cruisers attacked three English ships of older build and weaker armament. The sea was heavy and darkness enabled the two surviving cruisers to escape being sunk by the enemy. The British and Japanese squadrons which have been tied up by the siege of Tsing Tao will now take up the hunt of the several German ships which have caused so much damage to the merchant marine of the allies in the Pacific Atlantic and Indian oceans. A Japanese squadron is said to be ready to engage the five German cruisers off the South American coast as soon as they catch sight of them.
