Body of Lord Roberts Is Interred With Other Famous Military Leaders.

HUGE FUNERAL PROCESSION HELD Stately and Picturesque Ceremony Ends with Buglers Blowing "Taps."

LONDON, Eng., Nov. 18.—The body of fieldmarshal Lord Roberts, borne on a gun carriage, moved slowly through the streets of London today to its last resting place in St. Paul's cathedral.

The streets were lined with troops, while hundreds of thousands of civilians stood with bare heads in a cold rain as the funeral cortege went by.

The cortege reached St. Paul's at noon, where services were held before a reverent throng, including king George. The body was interred alongside the remains of Wellington, Nelson, Wolsey and other famous Britons.

Wellington Funeral Anniversary. It was recalled today that just 30 years ago the body of the duke of Wellington was interred in St. Paul's cathedral.

Lord Kitchener, secretary of war, admiral Lord Charles Boscawen, lord of the admiralty, and other prominent naval and army officers followed the caisson bearing the flag-draped coffin through the streets of London.

King George was not in the procession. He drove from Buckingham palace direct to the cathedral, which he reached shortly before the arrival of the funeral cortege.

Monks Said To Have Been Opposing the Carrancistas; Killed When Caught.

VILLA TAKES 6000 MEN AS PRISONERS Irapuato and Guanajuato Are Captured—Villa Gets More Artillery.

FIVE Catholic priests have been executed in Michoacan by Gen. Joaquin Amara, commander of Constitutional forces in that state, according to stories printed in the Military bulletin of Guadalajara.

Telegraphic reports from Leon say that Carranza's forces have captured Irapuato and Guanajuato without firing a single shot. Six thousand men of the Carranza garrison at Irapuato surrendered unconditionally to Villa.

Dispatches from Aguascalientes to the Associated Press, and received Thursday, say Villa's forces have driven the Carranza troops into Queretaro. Villa's trains have approached within 15 miles of Queretaro, but the main group is concentrating at Irapuato.

According to reports from the south, Villa's march to Mexico City continues uninterrupted. In all, Villa has advanced nearly 100 miles from Aguascalientes, making the journey in less than 10 days and without a single fight of importance.

Another large shipment of artillery has been made to Gonzales from Mexico City, these advices state. With the arrival of this shipment, local officials state, Gonzales will have an artillery equipment that will be the equal of any that Villa can move against him.

The War At a Glance

Violent fighting has been resumed within a two-hour motor ride of the gates of Paris at Tracy-Le-Val, where the main battle line from the north swings nearest Paris, a German advance led to a violent encounter.

In Flanders the artillery duel, described during the last few days as of furious intensity, has become still more violent, on the part of the Germans at least, but here, as elsewhere, the opposing forces are holding fast to their main positions.

Refugees from Belgium say that west Flanders, which virtually is cut off from the rest of the world, continues to be the scene of incessant military operations. They speak of an inferno of shot and shell as devastating with continuous cannonading and endless processions of the wounded.

The French and British are reported to have captured a small Belgian town, Paris reports that the hopes of the allies are again rising; that they believe the Germans are fast weakening, but there was no tangible evidence to indicate that the group of Germans on Belgian and French soil was being shaken loose, or that any decisive change in the immediate future could be safely predicted.

An official German communication states that heavy fighting has been resumed in the Argonne forest, eastward of which some of the most severe encounters of the war have raged, from time to time during the last month. A heavy loss, it is said, was inflicted on the enemy. In a battle between two squadrons of acrobats, it is said, one airplane of the allies and one of the Germans was lost.

Russian and Turkish Squadrons Share Injury, But the Czar's Fleet Retreats.

SEEKS SECURITY AT SEBASTOPOL Ottoman Warships Pursue; Russians Say Cruiser Goeben Struck.

Berlin, Germany, Nov. 18.—By wireless to the Associated Press. A Turkish fleet has engaged a Russian squadron composed of two battleships and five cruisers off Sebastopol, according to an official report reaching Berlin from Constantinople today.

One of the Russian battleships was seriously damaged and the other vessels, with the Turkish ships in pursuit, fled to Sebastopol.

Sebastopol is the huge fortified port on a projection of Russia into the Black sea. It virtually dominates the sea.

Another Sea Fight Rumored. A very severe engagement of Russian and German squadrons is believed to have taken place in the Baltic sea. Reports from Copenhagen, Denmark, state that heavy gun firing was heard Tuesday afternoon off the Swedish coast.

TURKISH CRUISER INJURED. Petrograd, Russia, Nov. 18.—There has been a naval encounter in the Black sea between Russian and Turkish warships. No definite news of the outcome has been received here as yet, beyond the fact that the Turkish cruiser Goeben sustained serious injury.

Fighting Carried To Within Two Hours' Ride of the Gates of Paris.

DUEL IN FLANDERS BECOMES FURIOUS Heavy Fighting Is Resumed in Argonne Forest; Losses Are Great.

LONDON, ENG., Nov. 19.—Fighting between the German and allied forces in the inundated territory between Dixmude and Nieupoort on the North sea coast is now being carried on in boats, according to official dispatches from Brussels.

Artillery, for the first time in the war, has proved ineffective there, but personal bravery and enterprise are counting for much and the battle is beginning to resemble the classical siege of Leyden in the 17th century, with rain and winter raids by means of flat-bottomed boats.

In these German and allied stand, six hundred men bring their rifles and even operating rapid fire guns with deadly effect.

Germany Reverses Attack. London, Eng., Nov. 18.—Germany, undefeated and apparently oblivious to all former reverses, delivered a series of terrific attacks today all along the western front of battle, with the exception of the extreme southern wing. Incidentally, the fighting was carried within a two-hour motor ride of Paris.

At Tracy-Le-Val, where the main battle line from the north most closely approaches Paris, there was a violent encounter. The Germans attempted to capture the town, which was held by the allies a few days ago. According to the French war office announcement, the Germans were repulsed.

GERMANZA MAKES ORIZABA CAPITAL

Mexico City, Mex., Nov. 18.—Gen. Carranza has declared Orizaba the new capital of the republic.

Mexico City, despite the dispatch of troops to the north to meet the forces of Gen. Villa, is quiet, but a feeling of tension prevails.

No train arrived at the capital from Veracruz Wednesday night. It is reported that the railroad traffic has been stopped at Esperanza, but the reason for it is not known here.

In a statement, Gen. Obregon says: "The northern forces have violated every armistice and promise made to us. I consider that all efforts made to settle the present trouble without resort to arms as useless. My command of the division of the northwest is ready to fight again in defense of the principles for which we have been fighting for the past three years."

Large bodies of troops left the capital for the suburbs of Sochimilco, where an advance, will be made against Emiliano Zapata's men, who threaten the capital.

GERMANS FEINT TOWARD WARSAW

Petrograd, Russia, Nov. 18.—The German advance in considerable force along the narrow front on the west bank of the river Vistula is regarded by Russian military observers as a feint at the city of Warsaw, the intention of which is to draw Russian troops from their advance upon Cracow and distract attention from the efforts of the Germans to establish a strongly fortified defensive line from Kallin to Cracow.

This plan also is calculated by the military authorities to relieve the German troops in east Prussia, now fighting way along the entire line, by rendering a Russian further advance unprofitable. Despite this German demonstration, the covering lines of the Russian advance on the Austrian frontier of Cracow are steadily progressing. The Russians now, having now reached within 25 miles of that point.
