

MAYTORENA IMPRISONS CALBRAL; VILLA MOVES TO QUERETARO

Villa's General Sent to Sonora Disagrees With Maytorena and is Said to Be Planning to Join Carranza—Villa to Consult With Zapatista Leaders at Queretaro—Pushing Attack On Tampico.

DOUGLAS, Asst., Feb. 5.—Gen. Juna Calbral, who was ordered by the Mexican convention nearly two months ago to proceed to Sonora to take command of the anti-Carranza troops in that state and who vanished after joining Gen. Maytorena at Nogales, Son., reappeared here today, having escaped from Cananea, where he had been held a prisoner by Gen. Jose Maytorena.

with about 2500 troops from Chihuahua, via Juarez, to take command in Sonora when it appeared that Gen. Maytorena was not only unable to capture Naco, Son., but was running Mexico into danger of war with the United States through loss of life and other damage at Naco, and his withdrawal from the fighting across the line.

CONVENTION troops, marching on Tampico, have established positions within 55 miles of the port, according to advices received by Villa agents here. Small detachments, operating practically independently, have previously reached points closer to the port than this, but the present positions are those of the main army that is marching on Tampico from the direction of Victoria.

Villa Goes to Queretaro. Gen. Felipe Angeles has not left the Monterey territory, according to these advices, but has such complete control of the surrounding country that he is able to completely restrict the rear of any movement made from Victoria towards Tampico. Although no word as to the commander of the army operating in the district for some months.

Villa to Treat With Zapata. One purpose of the trip to Queretaro by Villa is to treat with the Zapatista forces, according to advices received by Carranza agents here. These advices declare that, despite constant promises of friendship, Villa not only cannot rely on Zapata but actually fears attack from him. The Zapatistas, according to recent advices, hold practically all of Morelos and are stationed in a semicircle close to the capital, with the northern base at Cuernavaca.

Gen. Calbral, after being held prisoner by Maytorena at Cananea and later making a narrow escape, has arrived here, according to Carranza advices. It is stated in the Carranza advices from Douglas that Calbral finally broke with Maytorena when he was appointed military governor of the state. Calbral ordered a part of his troops, which recently passed through Juarez, to come north and Maytorena, fearing to lose control of the state, arrested Calbral at Cananea. The advices add that Calbral is a warm personal friend of P. Elias Calles, Carranza commander of the Agua Prieta garrison, and that he has recently tentative offers to Calles to join him.

Monterey—Who Holds Monterey? Conflicting reports regarding the Monterey campaign continue to be received. Villa representatives here state that the whole section is under the control of Villa forces, and that convention troops are advancing north on C. P. Diaz, headed by Gen. Rosalio Hernandez. Advices by Carranzistas, on the other hand, state positively that Monterey is surrounded and that Villistas, in attempting to evacuate it, have been twice defeated.

Zapatistas Cleared Out. The state of Puebla and the entire territory along the Veracruz-Mexico City line has been completely cleared of Zapatistas, according to messages received by Carranza agents here through Juarez. Arrangements are being made for the sending of additional troops to Mexico City. The garrison there, under command of Gen. Benjamin Hill, is reported by Carranzistas to number 15,000. Efforts are being made to open the southern line from the capital to Guadalupe, which is held by Gen. Miguel Diezue.

CONSTITUTION DAY CELEBRATED WITH PARADES IN JUAREZ. A big celebration was held Friday in Juarez in honor of the anniversary of the granting of a constitution to Mexico by Benito Juarez, on Feb. 5, 1857. In the morning a parade of all of the troops in the city, headed by Gen. Tomas Ornelas, military commander of the city, and his staff, and mayor Juan N. Medina, marched through the streets to the Juarez monument. Here the school children of the city, carrying flags, were assembled. Following a march to the Juarez monument, a number of functions will be held tonight, though not of a public nature. Flags on the customs house and all other public buildings are flying and a number of the stores have been decorated.

CARRANZA ISSUES THREAT TO DEPORT SPAIN'S MINISTER. Washington, D. C., Feb. 5.—Unless the Spanish minister at Mexico City immediately surrenders Angel Del Caso, the Spanish minister, to an agent of the Spanish government, the minister will be handed his passports by Venustiano Carranza, according to an official message received here from Veracruz. Del Caso is supposed to be hiding in the Spanish legation at Mexico City. The Spanish embassy here says Del Caso was a representative of Spain with Gen. Villa, just as U. S. Consul George C. Culver represents the United States. The Carranza agency here asserts Del Caso has actively aided the conventionalists. Carranza hides and are holding it for export duty, although this duty previously was paid to the Carranzistas at port Maatlan. The controversy is expected to be amicably settled. The cruiser San Diego arrived here today.

MEXICANS HOLD STEAMER FOR SECOND DUTY PAYMENT. On Board U. S. S.
