MEXICAN CATTLE RECEIPTS HEAVY

Marked Increase Shown in Imports of Both Sheep and Cattle.

Heavy imports of both cattle and sheep were made at the port of El Paso during the week.

The second half of a shipment of approximately 1000 head of sheep was received Monday and the dipping began on the same day.

Eighteen cars of Mexican cattle, entered from Sonora at Huerfano, Ariz., arrived in the city Monday en route to Wagoner, Col.

About 1000 head of Chihuahuas cattle was entered Saturday and Monday. This includes 450 head entered by state Holmen, which will be shipped to the Fort Worth market.

New Mexico Modifies Quarantine. Notification was received here Monday that New Mexico has so far removed the quarantine as to allow the entry into the state of stock from other sections under specified conditions.

All minds ought to be trained to act quickly. No matter how great your power of logically reasoning out big problems, no matter how capable you are of slow constructive thinking, your mind is thoroughly useless to you unless it can grapple quickly with the sudden emergency in a matter of seconds.

All through life emergencies arise. They demand almost instantaneous action. They have to be met and faced on the second. And the mind that cannot adjust itself to a new set of circumstances and react on them promptly is rather useless to its owner.

One of the stories that delighted my youth was the tale of a little Dutch boy who was warning about the dikes of Holland and held a tiny hole through which the water was trickling. While he gazed the trickle became a stream. He realized at once that before he could get help the stream must become a torrent.

The tendency in case of sudden emergency is to rush about madly, screaming and lamenting and seeking some blind way of escape. In useless action—energy is wasted. If there is a minute or two to spare in emergency, a wise way of meeting it is to sit down very quietly and think over possibilities.

Do you know of any reason why you can't speed up your thoughts? The reason you can't think quickly is probably because you aren't in the habit of thinking at all. You look at things daily and you haven't a word to say about them.
