MARLIN, Texas, March 5.— Promptly at 11:45 o'clock one dark and dreary morning a few days ago Messrs. Christy Mathewson and Fred Merkle sat down before the checker board in the lobby of the Arlington hotel and resumed the game of checkers that was begun at 2:30 p. m. in the spring of 1912.

There was, perhaps, less pomp attached to the opening this year than ever before. Mr. Mathewson jumped three of Mr. Merkle's men in four hours and a half and reached the king row by midnight whereas it has heretofore always taken the Old Marster at least nine hours flat to execute the feat.
