Weather Instruments Covered. At the weather office Col. N. D. Lane reported that his weather instruments were so badly covered with snow and ice that an accurate reading of the thermometer could not be made Monday morning.

The snow was general throughout the El Paso district, reports from the railroads and the Southern Pacific the snow fell as far east as Duran, N. M., and as far as Noria, N. M., on the western division.

On the Cloudcroft line, there has been snow for almost a month and four feet of snow was reported from Cloudcroft Monday morning. The mixed train is not being run any further up the mountain than Cloudcroft, as efforts last week to run a train to Luna resulted in two engines being derailed by the heavy snow.

Because of the heavy snow which covered the Juarez track and the disagreeable weather, the street cars were suspended Monday afternoon. Entries were being taken for Tuesday's races if the condition of the track will permit the horses to run.
