Don't Trust to Luck

IF YOU wanted life insurance, fire insurance, burglar insurance or any other protection, would you go to a reliable company or would you take anything offered you and trust to luck in getting your money?

In riding about the city isn't it best to ride with a concern that is reliable and responsible? You never hear of holdup men slipping into a street car and robbing the passengers. You never hear of pickpockets slipping into street cars and operating.

It was stated today by a citizen that on Monday he swore out a warrant in the police court charging an automobile driver with violating the city traffic ordinances. Up to noon today, the citizen stated, the police have been unable to make the arrest, although the citizen furnished the number of the car and the name of the driver as registered with the county clerk.

There are nearly 4000 automobiles registered in El Paso. Many of the drivers of "public cars" are new comers; their residences do not appear in the directory. How would you locate one of them after an accident if he wanted to get away?

If you were hurt in a collision between

some of the "fair weather" transportation outfits, how are you going to get satisfaction? You may eventually locate your man, but unless he owns more property than a homestead and the automobile he operates, what are you going to do about it?

You must know that in Texas a man's "implements of trade"—anything with which he makes a living—are held inviolate by the law. You might get judgments until the cows come home, but you could not get any money. You could not levy upon the machine and recover.

The street car company is backed by capital. It is a business institution. It operates under city ordinances and state laws. It has regular offices and regular officials, who can be reached at any time.

The street car company pays in many ways for the privileges of operating upon the streets of El Paso. It pays portions of every street that is paved in El Paso if it has a track or tracks upon the street. It pays taxes to the city and taxes to the state.

It helps to reduce YOUR taxes, for a city must have a certain amount of money on which to operate in a year. When the street car company pays its portion, yours are not so much.

How much do the "fair weather" transportation concerns pay to the city of El Paso? What do they save you as a taxpayer?

As a matter of justice, is not such an institution as the El Paso Electric Railway entitled to fair consideration? Aside from this, as a matter of safety, is it not further entitled to consideration?

When you step into a street car you are reasonably safe from injury—the percentage of injuries to passengers is so small as to be negligible; court records show this—but if you should be hurt, a responsible company is back of every street car in El Paso and you know how to find its offices.

You cannot help but notice the number of collisions among other transportation methods. The news columns of the papers are full of them almost every day.
