More About the One-Step

LACK of variety has done as much as anything else to make the One-Step ordinary. When we see couples tearing along with a set look and uttering a succession of steps that are virtually repetitions it is no wonder we gasp. Smoothness of action, no swaying of the body or swing of arms should be precepts to remember well in the forward and back first figure of my standardized One-Step and the side-glide. Smoothness of action can come only by dancing on the ball of the foot (not the entire flat of the foot) including the heel. I believe the One-Step can be made a dance of genuine beauty by slight changes and the introduction of some semi-fancy figures. In this article I shall explain the polka-variation. Please look carefully at the illustration on this page. It shows me and M. Clustine on the "one" count of the music, just starting the polka-variation.

SPARE RIBS WITH TOMATO SOUP.

Cover two pounds pork spare ribs with cold water and two tablespoons salt; let boil about thirty minutes; add one cup condensed tomato soup. If gravy is too thin thicken with flour stirred in a little cold water. Cook potatoes 25 minutes or until done. To serve place ribs in middle of platter, then a row of potatoes, then onions, gravy over all.
