GERMANS APPEAR TO BE GAINING

Berlin Claims Several Minor Successes All Along the Western War Front. London, Eng., April 21.—Dispatches reaching London from the French front show considerable military activity, with the artillery taking a prominent part in the attacks made on one side or the other. There is little evidence, however, that either side has gained, but whatever small advantage has been reaped seems to rest with the Germans between the Meuse and the Lorraine frontier.

GERMANY OUT OF LUCK, IS REPLY

It's Kaiser's Misfortune If He Can't Get Goods From An Open Market. BRITISH ORDER BEING RELAXED Note To Count Bernstorff Shows U. S. Is Not Abandoning Principles. WASHINGTON, D. C., April 21.—The reply of the United States to the recent memorandum from Count Bernstorff, the German ambassador, dealing with exportation of arms to the allies, will be delivered today to the German embassy.

GUADALAJARA, second largest city in Mexico, and Monterey, capital of Nuevo Leon, have been evacuated by Villa troops, which are hurrying to reinforce their leader's defeated army at Aguascalientes, according to reports received here Wednesday from both Carrancista and Villista sources. Both cities were evacuated without a fight.

TUCSON, Ariz., April 21.—Two Mexican outlaws, the Leon brothers, were shot and killed in a mountain gulch Monday night when confederates tried to rescue them from the hands of Pima county deputies who are attempting to rid Greaterville, 40 miles southeast of here, of bad men.

British Have 540,000 Men in France, Is Claim. London, Eng., April 21.—Speaking in the house of commons this afternoon in the manner in which the government is dealing with the question of war equipment, the speaker, Lloyd George, announced that while Great Britain had started in the war on the assumption that the conditional force would consist of six divisions, the country now had more than six times that number of men in France.

British Make Objection to Scraping Eitel's Hull. London, Eng., April 21.—It was disclosed in the house of commons Tuesday that the British government protested to the United States against the action of the latter government in allowing the German cruiser Prinz Eitel Friedrich to have her hull scraped when she was securing repairs at Newport News, Va. It was the contention of the British government that scraping the Eitel's hull would considerably increase her speed and therefore her fighting efficiency.

The police checked up the hotel register today and could find no trace of either man.

Germany and Austria Aid Relief in Poland. Berlin, Germany, April 21.—Germany and Austria have pledged \$50,000 monthly to the Rockefeller Foundation and to Elliott Woodward of Boston, who is in charge of American relief work in Poland. This sum is considered the minimum with which effective relief measures in Poland can be instituted.
