LABOR PROBLEM IS WAR PUZZLE

British Labor Unions Fear Women May Permanently Supplant Men.

London, Eng., April 29.—Equal pay for equal work, the training of inexperienced women and the supervision of labor conditions are the main problems with which the government has to deal in its scheme of providing war work for women.

The pay matter is serious in the view of the trades unions, which fear the employers will use the less paid women in order to oust men and at the end of the war refuse to restore men to their old positions.

That women volunteering for war service work should join the unions in order to maintain present conditions was the advice from Sylvia Pankhurst at a recent conference under auspices of the Emergency Workers' National committee.

German Shell Opens Grave; Skeleton Hurdled High on Church Tower


