POWER PROJECT CLUB AT CUTTER FOR FISHERMEN

El Pasoans Joining in Organizing a Club With a Membership of 150.

The Jornada Country club is the first of the clubs to be organized to take advantage of the fishing, boating, swimming and hunting that will be afforded with the completion of Elephant Butte dam.

El Paso's chamber of commerce will cooperate with the El Paso Valley Water Users' association and the Elephant Butte association in getting the power possibilities of the Elephant Butte dam developed.

At a meeting of the chamber of commerce directors, which was attended by Felix Martinez, representing the Water Users' association, a committee composed of R. E. Orndorff, George H. Le Baron and Henry S. Beach was appointed at this meeting to advise until the power project is a reality.

The chamber of commerce will also work with the El Paso Valley Water Users' association and the Elephant Butte Water Users' association in entertaining the congressional committee that will inspect the Elephant Butte dam in June 2 and 3. It was agreed that each of the three associations should bear one third of the expenses of the entertainment.

Joint Meeting to Be Held. A meeting of committees of the three associations, to be appointed soon, will be held at the chamber of commerce at 8 o'clock Friday evening, when final plans for the entertainment will be made. The joint committee will arrange for autos to take the committee over the valley, for a reception committee at the dam and for a banquet at Hotel Paso del Norte.

A communication from the El Paso County Medical society, regarding the appointment of a committee to work with the chamber of commerce for the betterment of public health, was read. The medical society has appointed Dr. J. M. Richmond, J. W. Tappan and C. F. Braden as a committee and W. G. Roe was appointed chairman of the chamber of commerce committee, the other appointments to the committee to be made later.

Locke's Road Book. Harry J. Locke appeared before the directors and submitted a proposition whereby the chamber of commerce take a two page advertisement in a new road book that he is preparing. The cost of the advertisement will be \$150 and the chamber of commerce will receive 500 of the new books. It was stated that a number of chambers of commerce had already reserved space in the book. The matter was referred to the advertising committee.

The chamber of commerce endorsed the proposition to further the farm extension work by supporting a bill that will be introduced in the state legislature, providing for a check amounting to \$50,000, a like sum to be paid by the federal government.
