

WILLIAMS GOING BACK TO TORREON

Report Received Here to This Effect; Arrietas Nearing Torreon.

Unconfirmed reports reached El Paso last night that the Villa army has commenced a northern retreat from its trenches around Leon, south of Aguacalientes.

Mapina, a rich mining district but 25 miles from Torreon, has been occupied by the Arrietas, according to reports received here three days ago.

The continued advance of the Carranzas troops from the Monterey section is also reported to have arrived in the south. Fighting to the west of the city has been frequent and a number of wounded from the Carranzas have arrived at Torreon, the passengers say.

NO Famine, Says Carranza Advice

Food Is Purchased to Relieve Mexico City; There Is Plenty Elsewhere.

Veracruz, Mex., June 1.—Venustiano Carranza today, through his secretary of war and marine, instructed the authorities in all territory controlled by him that they would be supplied with cereals and provisions whenever it is necessary for the people to have them.

The governor of Guanajuato telegraphs that they have a big excess that can be used to supply other localities. The food situation in Mexico City is declared pitiable and Carranza is collecting supplies to meet the situation when the Constitutionalists enter the city.

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URGES EL PASO TO AID MEXICO

Red Cross Would Stop Munition Exports and Receipt of Food.

Washington, D. C., June 1.—An embargo against exportation of arms to Mexico and against imports of food-stuffs to the United States as a step in relieving famine conditions was urged today by the Red Cross.

Send Food to Conals. As an experiment, Red Cross food supplies will be sent to American consuls who will form responsible local committees to distribute them.
