

DRAGGED FROM AUTO BY HAIR

Mexican Woman Reported to Have Been Kidnaped by Two Soldiers.

Two soldiers in uniform were reported to the police to have dragged a Mexican woman from a pickel automobile when it was near the intersection of Montana street and Cotton avenue about 11:30 Friday night.

The driver of the nickel car called the police and told the officers that a Mexican woman had entered his auto but that two soldiers appeared, dragged the woman from the car by the hair and disappeared with her in the direction of the mesa. He did not know either of the men, he said, but identified them as soldiers by their uniforms, he declared.

Soldier Arrested. Later, when policeman Brown was making a search for the three, a soldier approached the auto in which he was riding and asked the driver if they could carry three more passengers.

Policeman Brown, who was in plain clothes, answered that they could and they started in search of the two others who were said by the soldier to have been a man and a woman. They were unable to locate them and returned to the police station, where a charge of being a suspicious character was made by the police against W. Camell, said to be a member of the police M. 20th Infantry.

The police were unable to locate the Mexican woman Saturday morning, although chief Don Johnson and detective W. A. George had a number of men searching for her.

WAR AND DRUG TAX WILL BE DUE AGAIN ON JULY 1

War taxes will be due again on July 1 and one-half of the tax for the full year will be due on that date. Deputy Internal tax collector Harry Pateman has received notice from the collector of internal revenue at Austin notifying him that the special emergency war tax expires on Dec. 31, 1915, and the half-year payment will be due the first of next month.

CUSTOMS OFFICERS SEIZE A BAR OF SMUGGLED LEAD

Customs officers seized a bar of lead bullion being smuggled across the border by two Mexicans in an automobile, Thursday at a point up the valley. Although the bar had been changed so as to eradicate the smelter name, it was identified as bullion from the Penoles smelter, at Mapamat, Mex. and it is believed to be stolen from the smelter. The customs officers are increasing their vigilance to prevent El Paso being made a "fence" for stolen Mexican goods. Any goods not brought over and declared in the required manner will be immediately seized on the suspicion that they are stolen property.
