

COUP D'ETAT IN CHINA EXPECTED

Japan Looks for Yuan Shi Kai to Quickly Restore Monarchical Rule.

Tokyo, Japan, Oct. 12.—The possibility of a coup d'etat in China whereby Yuan Shi-kai would proclaim himself emperor is eagerly discussed throughout Japan.

The press is for the most part opposed to a return to monarchy, believing existing disorders would be settled by the interests of Japan.

May Revive Old Dynasty. Mr. Hsiao, the Japanese minister in Peking, who has arrived here on leave, is quoted as predicting that the imperial regime will be reestablished.

President Acceptable. Coming down to Yuan Shi-kai, minister Hsiao said: "Representative Chinese express the conviction that not entirely faultless as his past administration has been, Yuan Shi-kai is the greatest of Chinese statesmen and exercises such ability and in-
