

GARRISON DUTY TO START NOV. 1

Troops at Fort to Begin Indoor Work; Patrols Are Exempted From Duty.

The period of garrison training for the troops of the southern department will be from November 1, 1915, to March 31, 1916.

WARSHIP LIST IS ENUMERATED

Figures of Fleet as it Will be if Bill Passes, Given by Experts.

Washington, D. C., Oct. 22.—What the United States navy will be in 1915 if the administration's defense program is approved by congress, was described Thursday by naval experts.

Battleships of the first line, 27. These ships all carry more than eight big guns each, most of them mounted twelve 14 inch 50 caliber rifles.

Reserve battleships, nine. These ships are now in command or in reserve. The oldest ship in the class, the USS Oregon, built in 1897, is now in the reserve fleet.

Scout cruisers 12. This includes the Salamis, Chester, and Birmingham, the only scouting ships now in the navy.

Destroyers 34. This figure allows for the retirement of 16 destroyers built before 1908 and does not take into account 10 torpedo boats, many of which are still in service.

Submarines 107. The Schley, first vessel of this type designed for the navy, will be launched in a few days.

Coast defense submarines 143. This figure includes all submarines of this type now built or being built and allows for the retirement of nine boats of the A and B classes.

Gunboats 21. These vessels are for river and shallow harbor use. The new program will add only two vessels to this type.

In addition to the foregoing there are ten armored cruisers, five protected cruisers, four second class cruisers, 12 second class cruisers and six defense monitors available for reserve fleet duty.




