

BOLD DOWNS IN MOTORBIKE RACE

Bad Road Makes Accidents Frequent in Tucson-Phoenix Dash Against Time.

Phoenix, Ariz., Nov. 18.—Though Lorenzo Boldo, the Phoenix boy who won the Tucson-Phoenix motorcycle race, failed to lower the previous records for that course, he made remarkably good time when the condition of the roads between Florence and Phoenix was taken into consideration.

Between Tucson and Florence, Boldo made better time than did Joe O'Connell when O'Connell traveled from Phoenix to the Old Pueblo in 2:12, last March. This side of Florence, however, Boldo struck bad road and the best he could do was 3:21.19 for the 172 measured miles. He did not stop the engine of his Indian except at Florence, where he checked and took on gasoline and oil.

Big Too Heavy For Wheel. John Berg, who finished second in 2:22.14, was too heavy for the back wheel of his Harley-Davidson. The rim bent under his weight and he finished with only three or four sound spokes. Berg took a hard spill near Florence but was not injured beyond the loss of a finger nail.

Edgar Orr, of Phoenix, riding another Harley, finished third in 2:28.46. Jack Dadds, Phoenix, Indian, was fourth in 2:28.20. Al Rhodes, Tucson, Harley, 2:28.35.

At the wheel of a rebuilt Pope-Hartford, Ed Orr won the El Paso-Phoenix auto race last November.

Cranial Fracture Injured. Harry Crandall, of Phoenix, was the only rider to be injured. He spilled south of Florence and was ruptured, but he was able to ride slowly on to Phoenix.

Bob Perry, the best known of all track riders in the United States, had had luck in his first attempt at road racing. Between Tucson and Florence he hit a stump and demolished his Excelsior, perhaps the fastest machine entered.

Ellie Wilson, a Phoenix rider who has taken a number of road races, was towed into Florence with broken valve and chain.
