

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IS SHORT; WHERE TO GET MONEY BOTHERS

Big Deficit is Faced by the Administration With Plans For Expenditures Already Outlined for More Debts Next Year; Military and Naval Preparedness Will Be the Big Features Before Congress.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Dec. 2.—When congress opens it will be faced to face with a lean pocketbook and the prospect of bigger expenditures than ever before.

The growing opposition inside the Democratic party to the plan to keep the revenue issue out of congress, and as far as possible out of the campaign, by issuing the \$240,000,000 Panama canal bonds which are available, has become so marked that there are signs of abandonment of the plan.

Continuing the tax on sugar, and re-estimating the war tax bill will fall far short of meeting the situation. These measures will simply maintain the present income, whereas it is proposed to spend approximately \$150,000,000 more for the army and navy and \$50,000,000 under the ship purchase plan, while the total deficit for the present year, which must be considered in estimating how much revenue will be needed, will be \$65,000,000.

The need of revenue has started talk of a war munitions tax among certain Democratic leaders. A 20 percent war munition tax would give the government at least \$200,000,000, according to figures of the department of commerce. The total increased value of the exports of war munitions from the United States during the first nine months of this year was \$1,029,000,000.

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WANTING AT U. S. ARMY POSTS

Gen. Funston Orders Officers to Learn Game Laws; Cannot Use Rifles.

Hunting and trespassing on government reservations have been reported to the department commander, Gen. Frederick Funston, at Fort Sam Houston and he has issued orders that all officers of the southern department to familiarize themselves with the game laws and also with the federal laws and instruct the enlisted men in these laws.

The use of the service army rifle for hunting purposes is forbidden, and men wishing to hunt are instructed to supply themselves with sporting rifles or shot guns.
