FRENCH RESCUE MAN FROM KILN

Mexican Workman Overcome at Lime Works and Revived With Pulmotor

The Central fire department acted as a life saving crew Tuesday morning at 2 o'clock when the auto apparatus made a run to the Mount Franklin Lime company's plant at the foot of the mountain on Mountain street.

Debra Venable, an employe on the night shift of the plant, crawled down the kiln to unfasten a bucket which had caught in the hopper of the feeder. While there it was overcome by the gases which form in the kiln and was unconscious when the fire department arrived.

The fire department let down a life belt, fastened it to the man and lifted him out of the kiln. It was necessary to work with the man until 5 o'clock before he was revived. The pulmotor from the Electric Railway company was used and revived the workman.

TRAINED NURSE IN THE SCHOOLS

Equal Franchise League to Ask Help of Associated Charities in This.

A trained nurse regularly employed in the schools of El Paso is being advocated by the El Paso Equal Franchise League, and endorsement of the plan will be asked of the Associated Charities at its meeting Wednesday evening.

"We believe it absolutely necessary to the health of the school children to have a trained nurse employed in the schools," said Mrs. B. F. Denton today. "We now have two physicians who examine the children for defects and diseases, but much of the effort is wasted when we do not follow up these examinations with proper supervision by a trained nurse. Such a follow-up system would result in seeing that the children get the proper attention at their homes, as their mothers could be instructed in their care. A trained nurse making visits to the various homes of the children and watching the children in school would also help to keep down the infectious and contagious diseases."
