

BUSY AT RACES; FORFEIT BONDS

Rowan Puts up \$50 Each for Six Men Charged With Gambling.

"If they do not enter pleas of guilty and do not appear before the court, they forfeit their bonds, that's all. This was the statement of Judge Paul D. Thomas in corporation court Wednesday afternoon concerning the cases of six men arrested on charges of gambling in the Union hotel early Wednesday morning. The decision of Judge Thomas was made when S. Rowan, who represented the defendants, said that only two were engaged in the game and the remaining four were only onlookers.

"Only Two Playing." "I am representing the six men, although only two were engaged in the game, judge," said Rowan. "Well, if they do not appear before the court to answer to the charge or plead guilty they forfeit their bonds," said Judge Thomas.

"In that case I will plead guilty for all six men as they are working at the race track and cannot come to trial," said Rowan.

Hall Says All Playing. At this point Capt. Lee Hall, who made the arrest, asked if he might have a word to say. "All of the men who were merely onlookers I released before I brought the six players to the station, judge Thomas," said Hall. "The men under the charge were all playing."

"Well, if they do not appear they can forfeit their bonds, or if Mr. Rowan represents them I will enter a fine against each name," said Judge Thomas. Fines of \$15 each were placed against all six men, each of whom had a bond of \$50, placed by Rowan a short time after their arrest.

A TRIMMED PANAMA


