

GERMANS LEARN OF IRISH RIOTS

Berlin, Germany, March 30 (wireless to Tuckerton).—It is reported from Copenhagen that, owing to riots and to fighting between workmen and troops in Dublin and in other nearby places, a state of siege has been proclaimed.

No disorders of this extent in Ireland have been reported in cable dispatches from the British Isles, although various minor disturbances have been recounted in a riot at Dillamore, King's county, last week, three police officers were shot.

ADmits CHECK FRAUDS IN EL PASO, POLICE CLAIM

San Diego, Calif., March 30.—After having been arrested here yesterday, John S. McFadden confessed, according to the police, he passed bad checks in El Paso, Albuquerque, Trinidad, Denver and Boulder, as well as in Los Angeles and other coast cities. McFadden, who is 24 years old, lived in Boulder, Colo.

SHIP SEIZURE ORDER AMENDED

London, Eng., March 30.—An order in council was issued tonight "whereby a vessel and her cargo shall be immune from capture for a breach of blockade upon the sole ground that she at the moment is on her way to a non-blockaded port."

MEDINA SAYS 25 CENT DEBT WAS BASIS FOR KILLING

Albuquerque, N. M., March 30.—A confession the police claim to have obtained today from Jose Medina, that he killed Jose N. Chavez, a saloon keeper, who was found partially buried in a brick yard here a month ago, clears up one of the most mysterious murders here in some time. Medina asserted his reason for the killing was a quarrel over a 25 cent debt he owed the liquor man. Officers, however, think jealousy over a girl was the real reason.

RUSSIA TO BUILD 662 MILE RAILROAD IN MANCHURIA

Peking, China, March 30.—The Chinese government has signed an agreement permitting Russia to construct a railroad in Manchuria. The railroad will give Russia control in northern Manchuria, in compensation for the railway rights granted to Japan in southern Manchuria. Japan has consented in this agreement.

HEAVY FIGHTING REPORTED AT THE GORIZIA BRIDGEHEAD

Berlin, Germany, March 30.—(By wireless to Tuckerton).—A violent battle is in progress at the Gorizia bridgehead on the Italian front. Large forces being employed on both sides. The official Austrian report today announces the capture of 250 Italians. In the Dobruja sector there is spirited artillery fighting.

MINERS RELEASED ON MURDER CHARGE; HELD ON ANOTHER

Pueblo, Colo., March 30.—Eight former coal strikers held in the county jail for two years in connection with the killing of Luke Terry and several mine guards at La Veta, Colo., during the southern Colorado coal strike in 1913, were ordered released by Judge Essex, in the district court today, sustaining a motion by their attorney setting up the statute of limitation.

They will be liberated within the next few days and will be removed to Walsenburg. It is said, to face grand jury charges involving the death of a mine guard.

The dismissal here affects the information charging the murder of mine guards Bryan and Whitten. The defendants are Charles, Ed and Jan Richards, Marcus Martindale, John Flockhart, Charles Shepard, Peter Rich and Frank Krupar.

INNES AND HIS WIFE WILL BE SENT BACK TO GEORGIA

Austin, Tex., March 31.—Gov. Ferguson has indicated that there will be no action taken in the application of Victor E. Innes and wife, Ida May Innes, for a revocation of the governor's recalculation heretofore issued to the authorities of Georgia. When asked about the matter the governor said he "would probably take no action."

I. C. C. SUSPENDS NEW RATE ON RICE TO TEXAS-NEW MEXICO

Washington, D. C., March 30.—Proposed increases of ten cents per 100 pounds on rice from California points to points in Iowa, Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Texas, Wyoming and New Mexico which would have been effective tomorrow, were suspended today by the Interstate Commerce commission until July 29, pending investigation.

FOOT AND MOUTH DISEASE QUARANTINES ARE REMOVED

Washington, D. C., March 30.—All foot and mouth disease quarantines and restrictions on the shipment of live stock are removed by an order issued today by the department of agriculture to become effective tomorrow, with the announcement that the country now is entirely free of the dread disease scourge.

New York, March 30.—The appearance of Maj. Gen. A student who attempted to rally those opposed to preparedness was hustled from the hall and another who attempted to address the students on the campus was rushed and had to be rescued by the police.

TRAINED NURSE SUFFERING FROM TYPHUS AT HOSPITAL

Miss Eniline Silva, a graduate nurse who came here recently from Silver City, N. M., and who has been attending cases in the Mexican section of the city, is ill with typhus fever at the isolation hospital at the county hospital and is being cared for by two nurses night and day.

It is not known where Miss Silva contracted the disease as she had been living on Second street before going to the county hospital to work.

A case at one of the local hospitals was under observation Wednesday and Thursday for fear it might develop into typhus fever. After an examination Thursday morning the attending physician declared that the temperature was normal and that he was satisfied that the case was something other than typhus.

Two new cases have also been discovered in the Mexican quarter and sent to the hospital. Two suspects have been discharged from the hospital as it was found that they were not suffering from the disease.

MELDRUM RETURNS WEST FOR TRIAL MURDER CHARGE

Hawthorne, Wyoming, March 30.—Robert Meldrum arrived today and surrendered to the sheriff for a five-day trial on charge of murder in connection with the killing of "Doc" Bowen, at Baker, Wyoming. Officers have been searching since February 14 for Meldrum, who was under \$18,000 bond.

Meldrum said he left Wyoming because he was informed his bondsmen would be released from financial liability and returned when he learned they would be held. He formerly was city marshal at Telluride, Colo., and Baker, Wyoming.
