CONFERENCE MAY CLOSE AT ONCE

Gen. Scott Firm, Obregon Determined at Morning Session Thursday.

The morning session of the sixth conference between Gen. Obregon and Gen. Scott came to a close at 1 o'clock, when Gen. Obregon left the American side.

Have you made any progress? Gen. Scott was asked. "I think so," came the reply. "Does it look as though the conference will close today?" "I don't know," said Gen. Scott. "Do you feel hopeful?" "I prefer to talk about that after the 1 o'clock meeting."

Gen. Scott Firm. The conference during the morning hours was characterized by firmness on the part of Gen. Scott and a great deal of argument on the part of Gen. Obregon and his associate, Juan N. Ampudia, secretary of foreign affairs in the Carranza government.

It is reported that in the event that the two generals fail to agree and sign the agreement originally drawn up, the entire matter will be referred to Washington and Mexico with the understanding that it will be taken up again in the form of an arbitration conference.

AMERICANS IN NORTHERN CHIHUAHUA ORDERED TO LEAVE

It is understood that American consul Thomas D. Edwards, in Juarez, received instructions from the state department Wednesday to again instruct all Americans to leave Mexico because of the activities of roving bands.
